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## Value of 5-5 Bids

- $84 \%$ of the time partner will have a fit (3+ cards) in one suit
- You might declare with fewer points
- Implies shortness in other suits
- Disturb opponents

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## Potential 5-5 Bids

- Michaels cue bid
- Unusual NT
- Sandwich NT
- After partners 1 NT opener
- NT interference bids


## Max / Min Concept

Typical Point Ranges for 5-5 Bids

Weak
Intermediate
Strong
*Recommended overcall, then if possible other suit

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## Other Factors

- Vulnerability
- Who are your opponents
- Location of honors
- Extra length, voids
- Don't be robotic, use judgement

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## Michaels Cue Bid

| $\mathbf{1 C}$ | $2 \mathbf{C}$ | $5-5$ Majors |
| $1 \mathbf{D}$ | $2 \mathbf{D}$ |  |

| :---: | :---: | :--- |
|  | $\mathbf{1 H}$ | $5-5$ |
| $1 \mathbf{S}$ | $\mathbf{2 S}$ | Other Major + <br> Onknown minor |
|  | 6 |  |

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## Unusual NT

Originally to show 5-5 in minors
Modern style: 5-5 in two lowest unbid suits

| Opener | Your Bid | Meaning |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1 C | , | H \& D |
| 1 D |  | H \& C |
| 1 H | 2 NT | Minors |
| 1 S |  | Minors |
| 1 NT | $\checkmark$ | Minors |

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## Unusual responses...

$\checkmark$ Most common - show preference
$\checkmark$ Bid your own long quality suit (not forcing)
$\checkmark$ Jump to game with strong hand or to extend the preempt
$\checkmark$ 3NT - extremely rare (transporation issues)

## Sandwich NT

$\checkmark$ After opponents bid 2 suits
$\checkmark$ Artificial 1 NT (not 15-17 pts)
shows 5-5 in unbid suits
$\checkmark$ Must be alerted "Sandwich"

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## Examples

- Michaels cue bid
- Unusual NT
- Sandwich NT


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## Recommendations

$\checkmark$ Its all about partnership agreements
$\checkmark$ Start with Michaels, get experience
$\checkmark$ Don't cheat on 5-5
(partner will pick shorter and be unhappy)
$\checkmark$ Down 1 is often good bridge

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
