## OPENER'S REBID AFTER LEBENSOHL SEQUENCE

Example 1: You hold the following hand
AKJ3 2
マKJ 6

- 1086
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 3NT - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has denied four spades and a heart stopper, but has 13+ points.
You pass.

Example 2: You hold the following hand
AKJ3 2
マKJ 6

- 1086
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - $3 \vee$ - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown four spades and denied a heart stopper, and has 13+ points.
You bid 4a.

Example 3:
You hold the following hand
AKJ 32
マKJ 6
-1086
$\therefore$ A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 2NT - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has instructed you to bid 3 \&
You therefore bid 3\%.

## Example 4:

You hold the following hand
A KJ3
-KJ 6

- 10862
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT-(2v)-3v-(pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown four spades and denied a heart stopper, and has 13+ points.
You bid 3NT as you have a heart stopper and only 3 spades.

Example 5: You hold the following hand
AKJ3
マKJ 6

- 10862
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a weak hand with at least five spades.
You pass.

Example 6: You hold the following hand
AKJ 3
-KJ 6

- 10862
* A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 2NT - (pass) - $3 \AA-$ (pass) $-3 \uparrow$ - (pass)
- ?

What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with at least five spades and 11-12 points.
You bid $4 \boldsymbol{A}$.

Example 7:
You hold the following hand
AK 3

- K Q 6
- 10862
* A Q 32
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 2NT - (pass) - $3 \boldsymbol{*}$ - (pass) - $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with at least five spades and 11-12 points.
You bid 3NT, as you have maximum points but only two spades.


## Example 8:

You hold the following hand

- K 32
-K76
-10862
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 2NT - (pass) - $3 \boldsymbol{*}$ - (pass) - $3 \boldsymbol{n}$ - (pass) - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with at least five spades and 11-12 points.
You pass, as you have minimum points.

Example 9:
You hold the following hand
AK 32

- K 76
- 10862
\& A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT-(2v)-3a-?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with at least five spades and 13+ points.
With three card support you bid 4 A.

Example 10:
You hold the following hand
AK 3

- KJ76
- 10862
- A Q 3
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with exactly five spades and $13+$ points.
With only two card support and the hearts stopped you bid 3NT.

The hands considered so far have been chosen such that opener's rebid is fairly obvious.

We now consider a few hands where the rebid is not obvious.

Example 11:
You hold the following hand
AK 3
$\checkmark 976$

- AJ 86
\& A Q 32
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 3 - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand with exactly five spades and 13+ points.

Example 12:
You hold the following hand
AJ 3
$\checkmark 976$

- AJ 86
\& A Q 32
and the bidding has gone
1NT - (2v) - 3NT - ?
What do you bid?
Partner has shown a hand without a heart stopper and without four spades and 13+ points.
