I am told that sometime soon the Kitchen will be refurbished and when I know the details I will pass the information on. I was also told a while back that the chairs were going to be replaced (or at least the older ones) but that has gone rather quiet so I am endeavouring to find out some more . . . .

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

**DEALING MACHINE et seq:** We purchased our Dealing Machine ("Dealer 4") in March 2007 with the help of Lottery funding. It took over 15 months to finally get some funding as the cost was c£3500 which is about the cost today. Since that time it has not required servicing and (I hope I am not tempting fate!!) has performed faultlessly. Since purchase it has dealt 24257 boards. Our machine, unlike some makes, does not require bar coded playing cards. The machine only deals the cards - it needs a computer program to tell it what cards to deal to N,S,E and W. The program we use is called Big Deal – it is recognised and used world wide in Mind Olympics and World Bridge Championships as it is considered the very best random dealing program. It has been exhaustively tested by staticians and mathematicians. As a completely random dealing program it could very occasionally produce a set of hands whereby, say NS had 70% (or more) of the HCP's and EW only 30% (or less). To mitigate against this happening the only control I can exercise is to redeal the hand if the variance between NS and EW is extreme; I try to aim for about 2% variance so that both polarities have some decent cards. I cannot control the balance between N and S nor the balance between E and W. Every 12 months I run a check on the statistics and - no real surprise - this shows that whether you are N, S, E or W had you played in that position over the year your average HCP would be 10 or so close to it as to make no difference! The dealing program conforms extremely well to the expected mathematical probabilities of suit distribution and length of suits.

Once a year I manually set up a few "fun" hands for our Christmas party and incorporate them but as it takes over an hour to contrive just one hand this is not something trivial!! So, contrary to some cynics, the hands we play at our normal events are truly random and I do not fix them! Nowadays most bridge clubs have pre-dealt hands as with them comes the added value of exhaustive personal stats such as can be found on our web site results and by using programs such as BSOL (also on our web site) which should help everyone improve their game. The club has six sets of duplimate boards and the cards in each last about 3 years before requiring replacement. They would keep going longer but I think new cards are nice to play with so we don't wait until they are falling apart!
