Ken Craigie passed away in November 2003 after a long illness. He was a keen sportsman throughout his life, progressing from table tennis – 25 caps for England – through many years representing the Civil Service and Cambridgeshire at tennis.

For over 30 years he took part in many green point events and EBU Congresses, reaching Life Master in the mid 1990s, playing with Naomi Sinclair in a long and successful partnership. He won virtually every Surrey competition over the years, and represented Surrey at all levels.

Ken was a player who did not know the meaning of surrender, and was well known for his supreme determination in the face of adversity. He was one of the few people who lived totally by his principles and was one of the nicest guys on the bridge circuit, always ready to encourage others, always smiling and well-mannered. He will be sorely missed by his many friends and bridge acquaintances.
