Beginners' Corner

Who is the dangerous opponent? The one you don't want to be on lead either because they can take too many tricks or because they can lead through you trapping your king. Identifying the opponent you don't want on lead will help you plan the play of the hand. You are south declaring 4 spades holding the following spades:

A10 4

KJ852

Missing the queen, you could lead a low card from hand to the 10 in dummy, or you could lead the 4 from dummy to the jack in hand. If you have identified East as the dangerous opponent, finesse by leading from the dummy to the jack. Or, if you have identified West as the person to keep off lead, finesse by leading a low card from hand to the 10 in dummy.

Laws of Duplicate Bridge

Law 7: Control of Board and Cards Placement of Board

- A. Placement of Board
 - When a board is to be played, it is placed in the center of the table until play is completed.
- B. Removal of Cards from Board
 - 1. Each player takes a hand from the pocket corresponding to his compass position.
 - 2. Each player counts his cards face down to be sure he has exactly 13. After that, and before making a call, he must inspect the faces of his cards.
 - 3. During play each player retains possession of his own cards, not permitting them to be mixed with those of any other player. No player shall touch any cards other than his own (but declarer may play dummy's cards in accordance with Law 45) during or after play except by permission of the Director.
- C. Returning Cards to Board
 After play has finished, each player should
 shuffle his original 13 cards, after which he restores them to the pocket corresponding to his
 compass position. Thereafter no hand shall be
 removed from the board unless a member of
 each side or the Director is present.
- D. Responsibility for Procedures
 Any contestant remaining at a table throughout
 a session is primarily responsible for
 maintaining proper conditions of play at the

Health Reminder

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances (colognes or perfumes).

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem.

The ACBL asks everyone to give this issue the consideration it deserves. Please, if you're going to play in a club or a tournament, don't wear cologne, perfume, scented lotions, after-shave, etc.

The Common Game Jamie Portell

Common Game is a service offered through local clubs which provides bridge players the opportunity to compare their results with players at other clubs, playing the same hands, in Florida and across the country.

The Common Game offers pro analysis of many of the interesting hands played, personal play analytics, and awards monthly, quarterly, and annual prizes for both performance and attendance. It is a fun way for clubs to broaden their players' bridge experience.

Participation in the Common Game does not affect a player's score or masterpoint award at the local club. The ACBL masterpoints continue to be scored and reported as always. Common Game awards are based on matchpointed results across the larger field.

I've heard from a few players who are questioning the randomness of the hands played in the afternoon pair games which we receive from The Common Game. The folks from the Common Game have this to say:

"Yes, the hands are truly random. This is a common misperception since many players are often used to relatively "flat" hands produced in typical shuffle and deal games. We use the industry standard utility, *Bridge Composer*, which does not provide any options for attenuating or manipulating hand distributions. In addition, we are using the open source utility "Big Deal" (an option inside Bridge Composer) to generate the actual hands. These hands are added to our library and NEVER touched thereafter. Here is a sample from a recent month:"
