Have you ever wondered how the masterpoint awards are computed by our scoring program, ACBL Score? Merle asked me about it a few weeks ago and Ron found this information on the ACBL web site, but to make it easier for you, here are the basic formulas for some of the games we hold:

#### 0 - 20 Masterpoint Game

2 – 15 Tables

.05 X # Pairs for 1.00 maximum award 16+ tables

.05 X # tables for 1.67 maximum award

This is the same formula they use for masterpoint awards in cruise ship games when they are not ACBL sanctioned tournaments.

## 0 - 100 Masterpoint Game

2 – 15 Tables:

.06 X # Pairs for 1.20 Maximum Award 16+ Tables:

.06 X # Pairs for 2.00 Maximum Award

## 200 + Invitational Game

2 – 13 Tables:

.08 X # Pairs for 1.20 Maximum Award 16+ Tables:

.08 X # Pairs for 2.00 Maximum Award

#### **Open Games**

2 – 15 Tables:

.10 X # Pairs for 1.50 Maximum Award 16+ Tables:

.10 X # Pairs for 2.50 Maximum Award
