## THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER <br> By Paul Matheson

## STATE YOUR CLAIM

In many instances during the course of playing a hand it becomes obvious that one side or the other will win the remaining tricks. At that point Law 68 permits a player to make a "claim" for the rest of the unplayed tricks. The making of a claim is encouraged as it will speed up the time of play.

When making a claim the contestant MUST $a$. State the number of tricks he will win; $b$. suggest that play should be ended; and c . face his cards on the table. The claim should be accompanied with a detailed statement of his line of play. Play MUST cease after a claim has been made.

If the claim is accepted by the opponents the hand is over and the score entered (Law 69). If a claim is not accepted the Director MUST be called immediately and Law 70 applies. It is the duty of the Director to make a decision that is "...as equitable as possible to both sides, but any doubtful point as to a claim shall be resolved against the claimer". The Director will require the claimer to repeat his statement of claim including the line of play he intends to follow. The opponents can then state their objections and the Director may then ask all the players to show their hands.

If there is an outstanding trump the Director's decision becomes more difficult. If a. the claimer did not refer to the outstanding trump in their claim, b. it appears that they forgot about the outstanding trump and c. claimer could have lost a trick "by any normal play" the director could rule that the trick would be lost.

The Director cannot accept a claimer's change in the line of play from their original line nor can the claimer assume any particular play by partner as part of their claim. Also claimer cannot assume a finesse will be successful unless the opponent has already shown to be out of cards in the suit or would fail to follow suit in any subsequent play or if the play would be irrational.

The bottom line is one should make a claim whenever possible to speed up play but make sure you tell your opponents exactly how you intend to play the rest of the hand always making reference to how you will treat any trumps outstanding.

## FIFTY-ONE VILLAGES 299ERS SCORE WELL IN OCALA SECTIONAL By David Haskell

The ACBL Sectional Tournament in nearby Ocala is always one of the most popular tournaments for Villages, and a record fifty-one 299ers from The Villages earned silver points there on March 7-9. This summary covers only Villages 299ers who played with other Villages 299ers, and mentions only those who finished highest in their strata in 299er games.

The highest winning percentage among 299ers was earned by Marc Rissman and Sandy Baker, who had a $62.31 \%$ game in the Saturday morning 299er games. They finished second with $58 \%$ in another game. In the Saturday morning game Margaret Sarno and Gwen Wright finished first in the C stratum with a $61.55 \%$ game (worth over 2 silver points).

An unusual tie occurred in the Friday afternoon 299er game. Sitting North/South, Bob Matthews and Gail Hudon finished with a $60.04 \%$ game and earned 2.30 silver points. Sitting in the opposite direction in that game were Bob Tolpa and Maryann Deroche, who had an identical $60.04 \%$ score and who also each earned 2.30 silver points. The two pairs tied not only for first in the C stratum but first overall in the game.

Other first-place winners included Janet and John Dunn, winners in the Saturday afternoon 299er event with a score just short of $62 \%$; and Janet Gawenda and Bev Magnuson, who finished first in their section of the Friday morning 299er game with a $59 \%$ game. Dave Harris and Danny Clark were not only first overall in one of the Saturday afternoon 299er games but first in the C stratum in the Friday afternoon 299er game.

Also finishing first in their strata were Marv and Rosann Sherrill, who were first in C in the Friday morning 299er game. In the Saturday afternoon 299er games, Ralph and Jackie Williams, Leon Zaczek and Jan Gawenda, Maggie Finch and Margie Quinto, and Phyllis Solol-Wood and Richrd Ried all finished first in their strata in their sections, all with games over $55 \%$.
