## THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER BY PAUL MATHESON

One of the prime duties of a Director is to make sure the field plays in a timely manner. This is particularly true here in the Villages where our room availability is limited. Occasionally a Director must prohibit a table from playing a board when they have fallen way behind the rest of the field. The players are then advised that they will be given a "No Play" for the board. Some members assume that a "No Play" means they will get an average score for the board. This is not true. There is a difference between getting an "average" and a "No Play". In the June 2014 Newsletter edition I discussed the difference but apparently it is still misunderstood by many and I have been asked by the Board to revisit this area.

An average score is usually awarded when the board could not be played through no fault of the players For instance when the cards were incorrectly returned in the boards by the previous table. If a pair is awarded an "average" they both receive the average score for that board. For instance if the movement was a 13 table Howell each board will have been played 13 times. The highest score awarded for the board would 12 and the lowest would be 0. The average would be 6 so if both pairs are awarded an average they would each receive 6 match points. If the pair had a 41% result for the other 25 boards an average will increase their result. If they had a 58% game for the other 25 boards it would cause their final result to drop.

A "no play" is awarded when the hand could not be played and the cause of this could not be readily determined such as when the table is behind the rest of the field and the reason for the delay could not be ascribed to either pair. When a "No Play" is entered they are in effect playing 1 less board then the rest of the field. Their final result is based only the actual boards they played. Using the 13 table example from above all the other pairs will play a total of 26 board and their averages will be based on the results of those 26 boards. However the results for the pairs with a "no play" will be determined only by the 25 boards they played. Their actual match point score will be factored by the % results of the other 25 boards they played. For instance if the pair with a no play had a 40% game for the 25 boards they played they will receive 4.8 match points for the no play board (40% of 12). If their for the 25 boards is 55% they will receive 6.6 match points (55% times 12) for the board.

So an average award will affect the overall percentage of the pair while a no play will have no affect on their result.

Another misunderstood provision of the rules concerns a Director's authority to issue procedural penalties (Law 90) for "... any offense that unduly delays or obstructs the game, inconveniences other contestants, violates correct procedure or requires the award of an adjusted score at another table.". Examples of such an offense would be the late arrival at a table to play; "unduly slow play by a contestant"; discussion of a hand or play overheard by another contestant; unauthorized comparison of scores, touching another players cards; placing cards in the wrong pocket; failure to comply with a Director's instructions; plus others. Directors rarely issue these penalties and usually only after a most egregious act or if the offender continues to commit the violation after numerous warnings. A recent example of the seriousness of the penalty and possible repercussions occurred recently in the final round of an international championship. A competitor forgot to alert the opponents that a pass by his partner was "forcing". An appeals committee ruled that this was a violation and assessed a 2 VP penalty against the team. It lost the championship by 1 VP.
