DIRECTOR'S CORNER

The Board of Directors recently appointed **Russ Pearly** to be the Club's Recorder. The Recorder is the place to lodge a complaint if you believe a player has done something inappropriate, illegal or unethical. If desired the identity of the complainant will remain confidential but the complaint must be made in writing. The Recorder will investigate and track all complaints in a timely and appropriate manner. The Recorder does not have any disciplinary authority but if necessary will make a report to the Board of Directors for possible disciplinary actions. Contact and other related information will be forthcoming in the near future.

Since the "Season" is upon us we have a lot of new residents and visitors. We welcome them all! As part of this welcome I thought this would be a good time to review some of our club's policies.

We do not have a "guaranteed to play" policy. Some clubs have an "on call" person or allows the Director to fill in if someone needs a partner. Our Directors have the option of playing in a game if a player's scheduled partner was unable to attend at the last minute or if a player has an emergency after play has started. In any case the Director will only play if doing so does not result as a half table and their playing will not have a negative effect on their ability to run a game. The Director has total discretion as to playing or not playing.

In the event a player is unsatisfied with a Director's decision they may file an appeal to the game Director. The appeal must be made as soon as possible but in any event it must be within 15 minutes from the end of the game. The Club has an appeals committee which will hear the appeal. If these members are not available the Director will form a Committee of experienced and unbiased players. There should be an odd number of committee members so a decision will be made and not end in a draw.

The Club has a Zero Tolerance Policy to ensure all players have a pleasant and enjoyable experience. Examples of unacceptable behavior are acts of rudeness, badgering, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence. Also unacceptable are negative comments to either the opponents or partner; "constant" and "gratuitous" lessons at the table or loud and disruptive arguing with a Director's ruling (see paragraph above.) A first ZTP offense will result in a ¼ board penalty and a second offense will result in the ejection from the game.

Because we have limited seating and our venues are owned and managed by the Villages Recreation Department for the use of our residents, there is a seating policy in place. Both partners must be seated 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the game. If a player has not arrived 15 minutes to the start of the game the seats will be filled by a waiting pair. Resident/Resident pairs on the waiting list will get first priority. If there are no Resident/Resident pairs waiting then a Resident/Guest pair will fill the seat. If there is no Resident/Resident or Resident/Guest on the waiting list then the seat will be filled by Guest/Guest pairs.

The Club allows members with a disability to reserve a N/S seat. These reservations must be made directly to the game Director, preferably 24 hours before game time. At least one of the partnership members must be at their seat at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start of the game. Both partners must be in their seats at least 15 minutes before the scheduled game time.

As an effort to speed up play, we encourage all players to sort their cards by suit AFTER THEY HAVE PLAYED ALL THE BOARDS IN THE ROUND. Do not do it at the end of each hand and only do it if there is time left on the round.
