Chairman's Cup

The Chairman's Cup is an annual competition open to those who have been playing for less than five years. This year's event was held at the British Legion Club at Claines on Wednesday 1st May with 6 ½ tables made up of a wide range of players, some of whom had been playing for only a few months, coming from the Worcester, Redditch, Malvern and Martley areas. Play was at a gentle pace with fourteen boards being played over about three hours. Despite the gentle nature of the event, it was closely contested with the eventual winners (pictured right) only becoming clear on the very last board. The event was enjoyed by all, this being underlined by the return of many of last year's participants, including Eiron Evans, whose performance improved from finishing last in 2018 to finishing first this year.
