The hardest part of retirement for me was realizing that I was no longer the boss. I informed the Presidents of both units 194 and 230 after the May issue that this issue of The Maritime Bridge Line will be my last. Twenty-eight years has been fun but lots of work.

Retiring from directing Tournaments is imminent. Forty-eight years has been fun. But as soon as fun becomes work, it is time to be out.

Best wishes on our retirements and I hope we both have the grace to allow our successors to make their contribution even if we are not always in agreement.
