

# The strong 2 🛧 bid

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# Two criteria for bidding 2 🛧

**1.** 23+ HCPs in a Balanced or Unbalanced hand

or

- **2.** 9 certain tricks in an Unbalanced hand
  - i.e. You can win at least 9 immediate tricks in a trump contract with:
    - i. no help for your Partner
    - ii. a reasonable expectation of the split of trumps between your opponents
  - N.B. For 2. there are a couple of EBU requirements of minimum strength, the main one being to have 16+ HCPs



## Responses to a 2 shid

Content of	Response bid	
Strength	Shape	
< 8 HCPs	Any	2 ♦
8+ HCPs	Without a 5+ card suit	2 NT
or 7 HCP with Ace and King	With a 5+ card suit	2 ♥, 2 ♠, 3 ♣, or 3 ♦

### Rebid by 2 🛧 Opener after 2 🔶 response

Shape of Opener's hand				
Balanced		Unbalanced		
23 – 24 HCPs:	2 NT	Pobid longest suit		
25+ HCPs:	3 NT	Rebid longest suit		
	Responder's next bid			
Responder would only Pass 2 NT with < 2 HCPs		Responder can bid No Trumps to show lack of support for Opener's suit or too few points to think Game is in reach		
<ul> <li>With 2+ HCPs, Responder can use:</li> <li>i. 3 ♣ Stayman</li> <li>ii. 3 ♠ &amp; 3 ♥ Red Suit Transfers</li> <li>iii. 3 ♠ to show 5 ♠ s and 4 ♥ s</li> </ul>		Otherwise, Responder can : i. Support Opener's suit with 3+ cards (probably also with 2 cards because opener likely to have 6+ cards) ii. Bid her own longest suit		



### Continuing after a strong 2 ♥, 2 ♠, 2 NT, 3 ♣, or 3 ♦ response

- If you have 23+ HCPs, your Partnership has a combined strength of 31+ HCPs (23+ and 8+), which leaves your Opponents with a maximum combined strength of 9 HCPs
- You know you should make a Game contract, but can you make at least 12 tricks in a Slam contract? This is a Game forcing situation.
- All subsequent bids are informative and should be kept to the lowest level until bidder is certain of most suitable final contract

For example, in the Majors -  $\forall$  s and  $\diamondsuit$  s,

- ▲ A Game bid of 4 ♥ or 4 ♠ closest the auction
- ♦ Whereas a bid or 3 ♥ or 3 ♠ is stronger and invites exploration of a Slam
