CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

16th June, 2019

I cannot believe my first year as Chairman is already over. This has been one of the most exciting years for the NIBU due to the success of establishing Primary School Bridge. We are indebted to Norma Irwin and Norman Lacey for their tremendous efforts - there are now around 200 Primary School pupils learning to play bridge. By engaging with the youth the NIBU have created aspirational outcomes that will stand in good stead for the future of bridge in the Home Nations. This could not have been achieved without the team of enthusiastic teachers on this project. I would say confidently that the NIBU leads the way in Schools Bridge.

I am sorry that Greer Mackenzie has tendered his resignation as website manager after a lifetime service to the NIBU. His contribution over the years has been much appreciated and we look forward to his continued assistance to his successor. I would like to personally thank him for his continual help and support and there have been numerous times that I have been guided by his constructive advice.

The NIBU was kept to the fore in National Competitions. David Greenwood and Rex Anderson who had the tremendous achievement of back to back wins in the highly competitive Holmes Wilson teams event. Together with Paul Tranmer and Wayne Somerville they won the prestigious Egan Trophy representing the CBAI. County Tyrone won the All Ireland County Teams competition known as the Burke Trophy with team members William Dukelow, Dean Bradley, Bill Scott and Drew Lindsay. Many congratulations to the very popular winners and very well done. In the Camrose we had the excitement of Paul Tranmer and Wayne Somerville leading the Butler scores going into the last day of the Competition. We were delighted to welcome players from the CBAI who played in our Premier 1 League and to congratulate John Murchan and his team including the Irish Junior Internationals on winning the League.

On the International front our Senior team came 4th in the Europeans which qualified the team to travel to China to play in the World Championships D'Orsi Bowl in September. Our good wishes go with them and we will be eagerly following their progress.

I would like to thank the tournament committee who had their usual busy year with the promotion of events. I would encourage everyone to participate in all our NIBU competitions.

This year the NIBU had the honour of hosting both the Peggy Bayer and Junior Camrose Home Internationals. The event was organised by Helen Hall, International Match Manager ably assisted by Anne Hassan, Pat Johnston, Liz Scott and their team of Vugraph operators. The management logistics were world class and the other teams were very impressed with our attention to detail. As Chair I felt so proud of the NIBU.

I would like to thank all those who supported me during the past year; this includes the Officers and Council members and the members of the various sub committees. I would especially like to thank Anne Hassan, past Chair, who has been a pillar of support throughout. My thanks also for the continued reliable input of our Tournament Directors, particularly Alan Hill and Sandie Millership.

Every year at this time we think of those in our bridge community who are no longer with us or have lost loved ones. Sadly, the NIBU lost a good friend, competitive bridge player and past Chair of the Union, when Colm Duffy passed away this year. He played a big part in the promotion of Bridge and Golf in the Derry area. He helped bring to the city, and for a number of years sponsored, the NIBU Autumn Bridge Congress, now one of the best loved city venues for a congress in Ireland with excellent accommodation, shopping and restaurants. He will be missed by many.

All that remains now is one of the most important duties of the Chair - to select a successor. It is with great delight that I welcome Heather Hill as Vice Chair. Heather is well known and respected throughout the North and South of Ireland and the NIBU is very fortunate that she has accepted this role.

The NIBU has a sound base with committed volunteers who give freely of their time and we look forward to further advancement and success in the coming year.

Report of the Honorary Secretary 2018-19.

Affiliation

The number of affiliated clubs stands at 41. Brunswick, Downpatrick and Lisnaskea are no longer affiliated while Carrickfergus and Quoile have joined the Union. Clubs are reminded that the affiliation year runs from September 1st – August 31st each year with fees payable in November. New members may be added in throughout the year and the membership fee is still only £5.

Council

There were five meetings of Council during the past season. I am delighted to report a significant improvement in the level of attendance at Council meetings. For the first time the incoming Council met immediately after the 2018 AGM in order that pressing business matters could be dealt with swiftly before the summer break.

Management Committee

This committee is comprised of the Union's Officers and is chaired by the Honorary Treasurer. Its main remit is to report on financial matters and to make recommendations to Council. The committee met formally on three occasions but frequently meets on an informal basis from time to time.

Selection Committee

The committee met on seven occasions having settled on Derryvolgie Bridge club as a venue and Friday mornings as the chosen time.

Tournament Committee

The committee met on three occasions.

Laws & Ethics Committee

The committee met on four occasions. On two occasions the committee set up an Appeals Panel to hear and rule on matters concerning Premier League teams.

Sales of the annual **pocket diary** continue to be disappointing and club secretaries are asked to encourage their members to purchase one. The diary is now produced in joint form with the IBU and CBAI and so contains all the information needed for playing bridge anywhere in Ireland. It includes a full fixture list and details of all bridge clubs.

The Secretary receives a great deal of <u>E-mail correspondence</u> throughout the year. It is important that the initial correspondence carries a salutation so that the recipient knows who is expected to respond.

Report of the Honorary Competitions Secretary

My thanks are due to the Tournament Committee, comprising H Hall, Anne Hassan, Ian Hamilton, David Leeman, B McDowell, M McFaul, K Hammond and B Ewart for all their hard work throughout the year. Special thanks to B Ewart who emailed everyone each month informing them of what competitions were on, where and when and for distributing flyers, David Leeman who kept/keeps an inventory of all our equipment, checking bidding box contents regularly and set up the tables for the Camrose match, Ian Hamilton for all his work as League Organiser and also for the work he puts in to organising the Leagues, the Interclub and Celtic Sims Competitions, never mind the other things he does for the Union. The TC met 3 times throughout the year.

To say that entries to the various competitions during 2018/19 are disappointing is an understatement; although numbers were slightly up in a few competitions overall the numbers were down. The Robb Cup (an Inter B competition) was organised by P Johnston & A Hassan and again I thank them. I extend my thanks and congratulations to all competition winners.

The Kelvin Cup and the Mackinnon Cup were both organised by Brian McDowell and I thank him for doing a grand job.

The Millership Cup was organised by Jeff Millership and again a grand job. The Premier 1 League was organised by Ian Hamilton and TD'd by myself. The Premier 2 League, Inter A and Inter B Leagues were organised by Ian Hamilton and TD'd by Ian Lindsay, thank you Ian. The Novice League did not take place this year.

As usual all our Interclub and Celtic Sims competitions were organised by lan Hamilton and the amount of work lan puts into this is phenomenal. Ian produces all the booklets, having analysed all the hands and this prevents him participating which is unfortunate. Thank you lan for everything you do for the NIBU, you are, in my opinion undervalued.

We hosted the Junior Camrose match this year, organised by Helen Hall (International Match Manager) assisted by Anne Hassan, another successful event TD'd by Fearghal O'Boyle and Mairead Basquille. The Union received many plaudits at the end of the competition. The NIBU are the smallest Union, however we are the best organisers.

Brian McDowell, ably assisted by Tom McKeever, organised the NI Teams event in Portstewart and entries were up on last year, again my thanks Brian.

Anne Hassan is our Congress Organiser and has worked tirelessly for the NIBU for many years.

Sandie Millership TD'd the Provincial Mixed Pairs for me in Enniskillen, and numerous other events. For some events she stood in at the last minute. Ken Hammond TD'd the North Down Inter A&B competition, Eric McNicholl TD'd the Novice section of the Gala Pairs. Alan Hill TD'd the Gala Pairs and numerous others competitions and I thank all of them for their time and commitment. Thank you does not seem enough for all the work they do. Please if you are a TD at your club think about assisting us with our competitions.

The NIBU need some more TDs to come forward. Alan Hill has run many classes on the rules etc and I hope some of those who attended his classes will volunteer to TD some of our competitions.

On a personal note, I have been very disappointed by the lack of interest in our competitions. Is this because we have lost our competitiveness or is it just a case of no new blood playing bridge? I do know that a few of our Grammar Schools hold classes so perhaps there is a future in bridge! Having said that, once our senior pupils move on to University alas bridge seems to be lost forever to them within our Province. At this stage I should thank Norma Irwin and her team for the amount of work being done in the primary schools in the Carrickfergus area. This we would like to roll out to other primary schools in the Province but it can only be done with your help. Again if you have the time to volunteer to help, please contact Norma. Volunteers are always welcome.

Can I also appeal to all those who come out to play bridge whether in a club or in a competition to bring their <u>litter</u> home or at least put it in the bin? It takes a long time to clear up after any competition, eg packing up the boards, computers and often the clothes, tables and bidding boxes. Please do your bit to help. Quite often after league matches Ian and myself have been there for another 45 minutes just tidying up, so your help would be much appreciated.

HONORARY TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

16th June, 2019

Our gross income has decreased by £4,686 in the year. This decrease is explained by no sponsorship for the congress thereby incurring a loss of £915 together with a fall in competition income and a small decrease in Interclub and Celtic Pairs income. The tournament committee continues to oversee the promotion of events but further efforts are required to encourage attendance at competitions. The Spring Congress was cancelled for 2019. Ian Hamilton deserves great praise for his continued work with the Interclub and Celtic Pairs which contributed £4,256 to net funds.

Competition expenses have decreased as entries are down. Our biggest expense is representative matches with both Peggy Bayer team and Junior Camrose being hosted by NIBU this year with consequent increase in costs. The cost of entry fee in respect of the Interprovincials competition increased due to more teams taking part.

Our expenditure for home international matches remains very competitive due to the continued efforts of Anne Hassan and Harold Curran with the support of La Mon Hotel.

A net deficit of (£1,461) was incurred for the year with our reserves decreasing from £54,600 to £53,139

NIBU receives a bequest of £2,000 from the Estate of Patrick Jourdain. This amount is specifically to be spent on Senior bridge and is being held in reserve for when we next host the Senior Teltscher Camrose.

We increased our Affiliation fee to the IBU to £2,500. The IBU have increased costs due to the success of Irish teams in International bridge with the Seniors qualifying to play in the World Championships in China in September..

During the year £1,157 was spent out of reserves on Junior Bridge. Expenditure on promotion of bridge in schools amounted to £747. Credit to Norman Lacey and Norma Irwin who are responsible for nearly 200 primary school children now learning bridge and many thanks to all the volunteers who help.

I would like to thank Alan Hill, Sandie Millership, Colin Jeffries, Michael McFaul, Norma Irwin, Eric McNicholl, Helen Cole, Wilson Hanna, Liz Scott, David Leeman, Anne Hassan and all the Club treasurers who lodge money for me.

We have reviewed the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019 on pages 4 to 7. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and FRS102 Section 1A (Small Entities).

This report is made solely to the officers, as a body, in accordance with our terms of engagement. Our review has been undertaken so that we might state to the officers those matters that we have agreed to state to them in our engagement letter and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the organisation and the officers as a body for our work, for this report or the conclusions we have formed.

Officers' responsibility

As explained more fully in the Statement by the Officers set out on page 2, the officers are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view.

Accountants' responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion based on our review of the financial statements. We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (ISRE) 2400 (Revised), Engagements to review historical financial statements and ICAEW Technical Release TECH 09/13AAF Assurance review engagements on historical financial statements. ISRE 2400 also requires us to comply with the ICAEW Code of Ethics.

Scope of the Assurance Review

A review of financial statements in accordance with ISRE 2400 (Revised) is a limited assurance engagement. We have performed additional procedures to those required under a compilation engagement. These primarily consist of making enquiries of management and others within the union, as appropriate, applying analytical procedures and evaluating the evidence obtained. REPORT of Chairman of Laws & Ethics Committee 2018 - 19

- 1 The Law & Ethics Committee members appointed by Council on 03 June 2018 were Rex Anderson, John Ferguson, Shelagh McCaughan, and Alan Sharp.
- The Committee met on 06 July 2018 at Kelvin Malone Bridge Club. Rex Anderson was elected as Chair.

The Committee recommended to Council

- a change to the Constitution to permit the Union to ban players who had been banned by another national bridge organization in order to comply with the European Bridge League reciprocity provisions.
- changes to the Disciplinary Code to provide that it was a disciplinary offence to fail to comply with screen regulations and to permit the Union to ban players who had been banned by another national bridge organisation.
- 3 the appointment by Council of a fifth member to the Committee
- Acting under the provisions of clause 6 of its Terms of Reference which is to advise Council on systems, conventions and procedures in Union competitions, the Committee met on 06 August 2018 at Kelvin Malone Bridge Club with Ian Hamilton representing the Tournament Committee to discuss changes to the League and Cup Rules, Competition Rules and Systems and Conventions. Final drafts of all above documents were submitted to Council for approval in late August.
- 4 On 12 September 2018 Council
- [1] appointed Toni Sproule as a member of the Committee
- [2] approved the changes to the Disciplinary Code
- [3] approved the draft Cup Rules, Competition Rules and Systems and Conventions
- [4] approved the League Rules subject to changes to Rules 2.1.2 and 5.2.2
- The Committee considered it regrettable that although drafts had been submitted to Council well before the Council meeting on 12 September, there was no feedback from Council members. Alterations were made ad hoc by Council without input from the Committee or the Tournament Committee
- A Committee Appeal Panel considered an appeal against a ruling of the League Organiser that a playoff was required to determine which teams would play in Premier League Division 1 [the First Appeal]. The decision of the League Organiser was upheld.
- The Committee agreed that the Standing Orders required amendment so that in future appeals the appellant and relevant parties should have the right to appear at a Committee Appeal Panel hearing.

- The First Appeal was heard by an Appeal Panel consisting of conflicted members of the Committee in flat contradiction of Rule 1.3.2 of the League Rules. The Committee *recognizes* that the members hearing the appeal should be non-conflicted members. The Committee accepts that the decision made was void.
- The Committee met on 15 February 2019 at Kelvin Malone Bridge Club to agree amendments to Standing Orders for ratification by Council and to appoint an Appeal Panel to hear an appeal against a ruling of the League Organiser that a Premier League team had played an ineligible player [the Second Appeal].
- On 21 February 2019 the Committee Appeal Panel considered the Second Appeal and decided that as the ruling had been made by the League Organiser who was a conflicted person, the ruling was void. The outcome of the match was that the table result was restored as the correct result.
- 11 At the Council meeting held on 26 March 2019 Council approved the proposed amendments to the Standing Orders of the Committee.
- At that March meeting Council also decided that the League Rules requiring that an appeal against a ruling of the Competitions Secretary must be made to the Laws & Ethics Committee did not need to be made to that Committee but could be dealt with by Council. Council then overruled a ruling of the Competitions Secretary and awarded a score of 10 VPs each to two Premiere League 1 teams. Council recognized that under the League Rules such a score could not be awarded. Council comprised conflicted members and by reason thereof the decision of Council is void on the same basis that a decision by a conflicted Appeal Panel [the First Appeal] was void and ruling by a conflicted League Organiser [the Second Appeal] was void.
- Council has established a precedent that in future Council, after ignoring the Conflicts of Interest Policy, can apply the League Rules or any rules of the NIBU by refusing to apply the rules by either [a] failing to follow the procedures laid down in the rules or [b] imposing scores which cannot be awarded under the rules.
- 14 Unless Council recognizes that in future NIBU Rules must be applied there is no point in having an appeal to the Laws & Ethics Committee an appeal can be made direct to Council.
- On 26 March 2019 Council decided that the League Rules applicable for the 2018 2019 season were not the League Rules approved by Council on 12 September 2018 and that the League Rules 2017 2018 governed the 2018 2019 leagues.
- On 27 March 2019 the Committee appointed an Appeal Panel to hear an appeal against a decision of the Competitions Secretary that a Premier League team had played an ineligible player and that the match result was amended [the Third Appeal].
- On 03 April 2019 the Council Appeal Panel considered the appeal against the decision of the Committee Appeal Panel [the Second Appeal] and decided that the League Organiser had acted without fault; that in breach of the League Rules a league team had played a player not registered with the Union when the match was played; and that the penalty set out in the League Rules should not be applied.

- On 12 April 2019 the Committee Appeal Panel considered the Third Appeal and decided that a league team had played an ineligible player and upheld the penalty imposed by the Competitions Secretary.
- 19 At the Council meeting held on 08 May 2019 Council, the Committee Appeal Panel decision having been appealed against, overruled the Committee Appeal Panel decision on the Third Appeal without appointing a Council Appeal Panel to hear the appeal.

The procedure used in Council was not the procedure used in the previous Council Appeal Panel hearing

- 20 During the year Council has
- [a] implemented the Committee Appeal Panel decision in the First Appeal when that decision was void having been made by a conflicted League Organiser and a conflicted Appeal Panel
- [b] appointed an Appeal Panel which upheld the Committee Appeal Panel decision in the Second Appeal but refused to impose the penalty prescribed by the League Rules
- [c] over-ruled the decision of the Competitions Secretary that a penalty be imposed on a team which had played an ineligible player when that decision was not appealed against to the Committee or to Council
- [d] over-ruled the decision of the Committee Appeal Panel in the Third Appeal that a penalty imposed under the League Rules on a team which had played an ineligible player without referring the appeal to a council appeal panel
- 21 The Committee met on 03 June to consider amendments to League Rules proposed by the Tournament Committee. Proposed amendments were referred back to the Tournament Committee.
- A majority of LEC members considered it deplorable that Council had deliberately failed to follow the procedures and rules set out in the League Rules which had been approved by Council. All NIBU rules and procedures are ratified by Council. It is unfair to apply rules and procedures to some NIBU members and not to others. Those to whom the rules are applied are thereby unfairly discriminated against.
- A majority of LEC members recommend that all members of Council should peruse the published rules and procedures which have been ratified by the Union and at the first Council meeting formally declare that Council decisions will be made in conformity with the provisions of the Constitution and the published rules and procedures of the Union which have been ratified by Council.
