

Chairman's Blog #2

It's early September and already the season is well under way. We have had the Barometer Pairs, the Paul Jones and the Mixed pairs, all were well attended especially the mixed pairs with a magnificent 17 tables. Publicising our events and reassuring newer players that these events are fun and not at all intimidating is a real focus for us this year and its very rewarding to see new players give it a go, enjoy it and return for more.

I was reminded of this when I heard Jonathan Agnew say how many people had gone to the final test of the Summer at the Oval just to be there to see Alastair Cook's final game and enjoyed it so much that they intend to return. I am sure those who try one of our events for the first time will wish to return for more.

The SCBA continues to offer support to our clubs and players and there are several events to note for your diary. We have a day for directors and, for the first time, scorers and a day of playing seminars from Caroline Macpherson. Details are on the web site. Many of you will want to make a note of the date of Andrew Robson's visit on December 5th. Details are on the SCBA website.

Our first Fast Forward to bridge course is already well advanced. This is the course run by the consortium of Sherborne, Castle Cary and Yeovil and already new players are testing the water at two of these bridge clubs. A second course started in Street on September 15th and you can read about this elsewhere in this newsletter.

Fast Forward Bridge Weekend at Street Bridge Club 15 & 16 September

After all the preparations, 11 hopeful participants started on the Saturday morning. Within fifteen minutes they were playing their first impromptu hand of mini bridge to begin the basics of clockwise movements, counting high points & experiencing the role of declarer, dummy & who's on lead. The language & mechanics progressed through the morning and by midafternoon they were playing the set boards with 1NT opening bids & 2NT &

3NT responses. A supper break at The King Alfred allowed time to chat and relax before returning for an 8 board, 4 table Skip Mitchell duplicate session which was scored by Ian Williamson. The Street Bridge Club team of helpers made up the numbers so guidance, assistance & support were available at every table. It was a long day & positive day for everyone with frequent breaks for refreshments.

Sunday morning and we were all ready for the day ahead; everyone returned and we started with a quick overview of what had been learnt on the Saturday with a contribution from everyone. It was remarkable that they had, as a group, retained & consolidated so much of the basic information including scoring. With the emphasis on play, experiential learning, with support at each table, the final set of the 40 boards were played. We finished the day with a 3 table 'see what you remember' session of 4 boards from Saturday evening with each player in a different position.

I didn't prepare a formal exit survey for the group – I have been on too many training days that present this for completion before you leave, but as the 10 who completed the weekend were all smiling and agreeing that they will sign up for the follow on classes. The consensus of the group was that they had learnt a lot in a very short time & were keen to continue their journey. Yes, they were exhausted but exhilarated; they had met new people & had explored an intellectual stimulus in a social, supportive & happy atmosphere.

The old adages of t KISS: 'Keep it Simple, Stupid' & 'Fail to Plan, Plan to Fail' plus the Count, Plan & Play strategy helped the learners to establish good habits from the beginning. At the end, they were becoming confident in basic etiquette, declarer & defence play with the added essential that it is a partnership game where communication is the key whether in bidding or in card play.

Only time will now tell how successful the weekend really was, but the future is encouraging and positive.

My thanks go to Ceri, Caroline & Steve for help in the initial preparations & to my team of Ian, Carol, Gill, Gordon Sheena, Gaye & Angela who all helped with their time at the weekend.

On Wednesday 18, 8 players returned & the missing 2 are planning to come & continue when they are available!
