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## **President's Introduction**

Since the last newsletter we can now see the new web site for SCBA. We are now reporting the results of our competitions on the same day as the event. In addition the website has other new features, the Diary of a Palooka is one amusing item and we are advertising other significant events held at Surrey clubs and nearby counties, so please check the site regularly for the latest news.

The September Sim Pairs raised over £3300 for the selected charity and the September green pointed Guildford events were well attended on both days.

November saw the Surrey Team win their heat and qualify for the Tollemache final in February 2016. There were 4 groups of 9 Counties in each group and the top two Counties from each group play in an 8 team final over 2 days.

The Chairmans lunch in November was well attended by the Chairman or representatives of 32 out of the 47 Affiliated clubs in Surrey as well as the committee members. Some of the committee spoke briefly about the future of Bridge in Surrey and the ideas being put in place to promote Bridge in the County. We have recently carried out an online Members Survey, a summary of the results can be seen below but in addition as part of the survey many people took the trouble to provide extensive comments and we are currently reviewing these.

I would like to thank Bomi Kavarana, who has been Surrey's Youth Officer for 18 years and who has, as his legacy, created and sustained the best County Schools competition in the UK. We wish Bomi a wonderful retirement.

## **Planned meeting of interested Club Development Officers**

To help membership recruitment in your club, English Bridge Education & Development is now running an important teacher training initiative to help all bridge clubs to 'grow their own' membership through an integrated teaching programme.

The purpose of this course is to provide basic training for club members who are prepared to offer a teaching programme at their club. This needs to be as part of programme to which the whole club is committed and which is designed to attract new members into bridge and then nurture their development within the world of duplicate play.

The key to a successful club teaching programme lies with evolving a whole year group from classroom to club room in no more than a year. Players should be integrated into the club as early as possible through a programme of teaching, supervised play, "no fear" duplicates and above all by providing an atmosphere of encouragement and welcome.

## How to nominate someone

The cost of this course is currently £106. The secretary of the club books places on these courses.

## **Youth News**

Tim Warren is taking over from Bomi Kavarana as Surrey's Youth Officer. Initially, the main focus will be on encouraging schools to set up Minibridge clubs, and for this to be successful we'll need Minibridge teachers. Minibridge is a simplified form of the game in which you learn how to play the cards, without having to worry about the bidding.

Would you like to teach Minibridge in a local school? Perhaps you have a child or grandchild who's at the school? You don't need to be a great bridge player, you just need to want to help youngsters to take up this wonderful game of ours – the main qualification is enthusiasm. Ideally, if you have a friend or two who would also like to help, you might share the teaching, but whether there's one of you or more, let Tim know.

We're holding our first Minibridge teach-the-teachers session at Wimbledon BC on Sunday 31 January 2016. You can book the course online at <a href="https://www.wimbledonbridgeclub.co.uk">www.wimbledonbridgeclub.co.uk</a> (see under 'Book Events' or 'Learn to Teach Minibridge' on the right. If Wimbledon's too far, or you can't make the date, contact Tim and we might be able to set up a course nearer to you.

Even if you don't want to teach, let us know if you have a link with a local school, especially a secondary one. Perhaps you might know a teacher there? We're looking for 'ways into' schools: unsolicited letters are very unlikely to achieve anything, and personal contact would be much better.

## Members survey 2015 - results

#### Report on 2015 SCBA Members' Survey

We have had exactly 200 responses to our members' survey (although some of the respondents did not answer all of the questions). More than 80% of respondents play bridge at least twice a week, so we have access to the views of enthusiastic players. 53% of respondents did not participate in any SCBA events last season.

I have filtered the results to look at each category separately. For example, it is not worthwhile changing the format of our events for people who have little interest in participating in our events whatever their format!

#### **Length of SCBA Competitions**

We asked our members what length our competitions should be. Of those who currently participate in SCBA events:

29 prefer two--session events (about 48 boards)

29 prefer extended single session (e.g. 32 boards) events

15 prefer single session

17 have no preference

The length of many SCBA events was reduced to 'extended single session' a few years ago, but the survey shows that there is still equal demand for two-session events.

#### **Timing of SCBA Competitions**

We asked our members when our competitions should be held. Of those who don't participate in SCBA events, few cited 'wrong day of the week' as a reason for not participating. Of those who do currently participate in SCBA events:

31 prefer Sunday

8 prefer Saturday

11 either weekend day

11 prefer midweek

30 have no preference

So the survey results show that there is a general preference for playing on Sundays, suggesting that we are right to hold most of our events on that day of the week.

We also asked our members about the starting time of SCBA events. Of those who do don't participate in SCBA events, few cited 'wrong start time' as a reason for not participating. Of those who do currently participate in SCBA events:

26 prefer current start time (1pm)

24 would prefer an earlier start time

3 would prefer a later start time

38 had no strong preference

A significant minority would prefer to start earlier (although we didn't ask them how much earlier!), but there is still (slightly) more support for the current start time of 1pm.

We asked our members about provision of food at SCBA events, explaining that tea and coffee are available anyway. Of those who do currently participate in SCBA events:

13 thought plated teas should be provided

27 thought food should be available at the venue for players to purchase

28 thought food should not be provided, players should bring their own food if required

These replies suggest that whilst it is impossible to please everybody, the Competitions Subcommittee was correct to discontinue the provision of plated teas. Of course, it would be nice if food were available to purchase for those who want to, but the viability of this option depends on the particular venue being used.

#### **Suggestions for Improvements**

We asked our members to state what they like about our events and to suggest what we could do to improve them. We also asked those who do not play in SCBA events to explain why. The answers varied considerably (all responses can be seen in the pdf).

Quite a few people cited improving attendance at events (this is a vicious circle if people don't think that the events are not big enough to be worth entering, they don't enter themselves, helping to contribute to the events not being big enough). It would perhaps be better to hold fewer events so that the limited marketing resources available to SCBA could be concentrated on the events actually held.

Some suggested more green point events, not appreciating the restrictions that are imposed on us in that regard.

Some people mentioned venues, but of course they didn't all prefer the same venue. A few people were not happy with the chairs at certain venues.

Parking was mentioned a few times; indeed this might explain in part why Sunday was the day preferred by more people.



## **Surrey Qualifies for Tollemache Final**

The Surrey Tollemache team of Peter Lee & Mike Scoltock, Graham C Osborne & Frances Hinden, Paula Leslie & Jeffrey Allerton, Ian Swanson & Ken Ford, npc Richard Millard has qualified in some style for the final in February. Surrey finished the qualifier weekend at the top of Pool D with 114VPs, 14VPs ahead of second placed Berks & Bucks (who also qualify for the final) and a comfortable 25VPs ahead of third placed Derbyshire. The qualifiers from the other Pools were Kent, London, Manchester, Yorkshire, Middlesex and Worcestershire.

The Tollemache is teams of 8 scoring so each team has two N/S and two E/W pairs playing each hand. The results are 'cross-imped', i.e. each N/S gets to score up with both sets of E/W teammates, so there are four comparisons on each board. This can lead to some big swings. For example, on one board both E/W Surrey pairs bid to a good 6♣ contract which could not be defeated, whilst both Essex pairs languished in 3NT. That was four 12 IMP swings on one board, so 48IMPs to Surrey.

By contrast, I had to struggle to achieve a flat board on the following deal




Dealer E, Love All, Cross imps

The bidding requires some explanation. Playing 5-card majors and a 14-16 1NT opening, 1 was the systemic opening bid. Against the potentially short 1 opening, E/W were playing an unusual, defence whereby a 1 overcall would be conventional (showing both majors) and they had to overcall 2 to show a hand suitable for a normal simple overcall in the suit. There's a good case for playing 2 by North as nonforcing in this position, but N/S had agreed to play it as forcing. Although South lacks a diamond stop, it's still better to show the balanced nature of the hand by rebidding 2NT and all alternatives seem worse. If North is strong enough to raise to game, she still has the option to check for alternative strains with 3.

West led ◆K against South's 2NT contract. East turned up with ◆A86 and the defence cashed five rounds of the suit. East discarded ♣10 (playing McKenny discards) and then ♠8. Declarer pitched two spades and a club from dummy, and two hearts from hand.

West now switched to  $\clubsuit 9$  in this position with declarer requiring all of the remaining tricks:




Assuming that the clubs come in for four tricks, declarer has seven tricks on top. The ♥K cannot realistically be singleton, so the only possible source of an eighth trick is a squeeze.

If West has ▼K and sole guard of spades then winning ♠A and running the clubs will work (as long as declarer reads the position). A better line is to cash ▼K (Vienna Coup) before running the club suit: now declarer does not have to read which suit West has bared; moreover, playing the cards in this order has the significant advantage that the squeeze also operates when East is the one with the sole spade guard and ▼K.

What can be inferred about the opponents' hands from the bidding and early play? Well, East has signalled for spades, then discarded one, so East seems to be left with QJ10(x), so is guarding that suit. Could East hold \*K as well? Perhaps, but holding that card as well, wouldn't he have competed to at least 3. Also, West really needs that card to justify the overcall.

So the major suit guards seem to be divided and this line will not work. Can anything be done? Hang on: East can't hold  $\P$ K but it's still possible that he could hold  $\P$ J9 instead. Now it is possible to 'transfer the menace' in hearts from West to East. So win the spade switch with the ace and lead  $\P$ Q from hand. West has to cover with  $\P$ K, so win the ace and now run the clubs. In the 2-card ending South is on lead holding  $\P$ 8 and  $\P$ 5, dummy has  $\P$ K7 and East has to surrender.

This was the full deal:



At most other tables, N/S bid and made 2♠ (a weak NT opening will silence E/W), so the reward for making 2NT was just a flat board! (by Jeffrey Allerton)

It is a well written book and bridge club members will find it both enjoyable and entertaining. Below is the summary taken from the back of the book:

"Jeffrey Sparkes - bachelor with a social conscience - doesn't want to save the world. He merely wants to bring some excitement into the lives of retirees whose minds might otherwise be seizing up from loneliness or boredom; to bring people together... fill gaps in people's lives. And to provide for his own security... to never again be destitute in life. His vehicle is Merville Bridge Club. Sadly for Jeffrey, reconciling MBC's two main characteristics - friendliness and the competitive spirit - can be fraught. It is especially so as tension mounts in the final rounds of the Kelsey Cup competition, 2010-2011. Because discord at the Club is inextricably entwined with domestic strife, particularly in the case of three married couples - Jeffrey's best players as it happens – Weatherbys, Swansons and Rushworths. So complex and passionate are the conflicts involved that Jeffrey - with his Club threatening to implode - is driven to

admit to his best friend, Helga, about the gaps in people's lives he is trying to bridge: 'All I seem to be doing is creating them.' How will it end? Who will be the winners and losers in Kelsey and in life?"
