President's Introduction

As my 2 years as President draws to a close, I think it is worth spending a short time reflecting on the current state of Surrey bridge. Although I have been a member of the County for nearly 50 years I had no involvement with either the organisation or the Committee when the Chairman invited me to become President.

With almost 5,500 members it is difficult to decide what is required, and so at a recent committee meeting we discussed the need to improve communications with our Affiliated (and non-Affliated) Clubs so that we could help to promote bridge across the County. As a first step our Chairman has spoken to the Chairman of all the Clubs to encourage participation in the AGM Swiss Pairs. Hopefully this will mark the first stage in developing a much closer relationship with the committee, so that we can reflect the needs of the membership in our future plans.

The competitions sub-committee attempts each year to organise a programme of events to meet the needs of all our members. One of the difficulties has been to find suitable venues, but we have now agreed to hold most events at Oxshott, with a few others scattered around the County. Many people enjoy the opportunity to play teams bridge, and so we are running 4 Divisions of County Leagues together with a Novice League. Apart from Division 1 these leagues are regionalised to avoid a lot of travelling. This is an opportunity for members to start playing teams bridge against people of a similar standard, so I hope many more of you will consider participating in the future.

The communications sub-committee coordinates training across the County and helps bring new players into the Novice Leagues and "Friendly" events. This is essential to the future health of bridge across the County. The sub-committee also advertises forthcoming events and individually targets potential participants.

The County is fortunate to have a number of international players amongst its membership, so you can always test yourselves by playing against them in our most prestigious events, the County Pairs and/or County Teams (known as the Lady Rose Cup).

Each year the President chooses a charity to benefit from the proceeds of the Surrey Simultaneous Pairs. This year my chosen charity was the Sutton & Croydon Multiple Sclerosis Therapy Centre, which supports sufferers of this most common disabling neurological condition. I am indebted to Graham Wells for organising the event and enabling us to make a donation of £2,200.

It just remains for me to thank everyone for their support over the last 2 years, and to wish my successor all the best.



Winning defence by Graham Osborne



I played the Easter pairs with Alex Hydes and this was the very last hand we played. The opponents had a pushy auction to a thin game. Alex led a diamond to the Ten and K. Declarer played a spade to the Q and K. I returned a diamond which Alex won and cleared the diamonds playing the 2 to third round to show a club card.

I discarded the \P K on the third round of diamonds which creates an entry to Alex's hand. A low club discard allows declarer to make it through an avoidance play. That is, he plays a club from dummy next, ducking if you insert the K, and winning the Ace and playing a second round if you follow low. A major suit discard gives declarer an extra trick in the suit discarded and still leaves you a discard problem later. The \P K discard guaranteed 2 off and was worth 90% of the match points.

Surrey and Novice leagues

The second year of running the leagues in the new format is proving successful with many new team entering this year and mobility between the divisions beginning to happen.

The Novice League is used by teachers as a means of giving their pupils experience in team competitions, from where they can progress to the Surrey League

The Surrey League is divided into four divisions to provide competitive bridge for all players irrespective of experience and ability.

Division 1 Is the premier teams league competition in Surrey
Division 2 Is suitable for most of the top club players in Surrey

Division 3 Is for the majority of club players in Surrey

Division 4 This is the entry level to Surrey teams competitions and is broadly equivalent to the 'improver'

sections run by many clubs. EBU membership is not required.
