Peggie Stokes Memorial Award At October NLM Sectional

Prior to the October 2009 Non-Life Master tournament, Mary Cole established a memorial award to honor Peggie Stokes, who died in a tragic automobile accident in the early summer while visiting the North Carolina coast. Peggie had many friends in the bridge community and was an active player in the Tuesday afternoon 199er game as well as a number of groups in the Hope Valley and Dunbarton areas.

The plaque for the award, won last year by Sally Shook, hangs at the Triangle Bridge Club. Each year, the award will be given to the active (i.e., paid-up) member of ACBL Unit 191 as of 1 October (or the first of whatever month the tournament may held in the future) who has fewer than 200 master points recorded with ACBL as of that date, and who wins the most master points during the tournament. Such points may be won in pair, knock-out or Swiss team sessions. To avoid a tie, it is required that the winner play with at least two partners. One's partner and teammates need not have fewer than 200 points.

This year's tournament will be held at the Triangle Bridge Club the week-end of 15-17 October. Please be certain that your ACBL dues are current as of 1 October. If you have any questions about your eligibility, please let me know.

Face Down! John Torrev

Do you wear your seat belt in a car? I hope so – we need all you bridge players! Why do you do it? Because there's a law tht says you have to, and you might get fined if you don't? Well, if it took that law to make you wear your seat belt, that's fine with me.

Do you always make your opening lead face down? Probably not. There's a law for that, too, but most players don't know about it because it is almost never enforced. There's no automatic penalty — it's just something the Laws say we are supposed to do.

Why should you lead face down? Well,

- If you find out that your opponents had failed to alert or mis-explained their auction, the director will probably let you select a different lead. But not if you led face up.
- While the lead is face-down your partner can ask questions about the auction, without anybody suggesting she might be influencing your lead.
- You might be leading out of turn. Then the real declarer has a lot of options, and you don't. And the fraction of time you thought you were saving by skipping the face-down to face up delay becomes several minutes of ruling time.
- The Laws (Law 41A, to be exact) say you should.

Probably because our directors have not penalized face-up leads, we have all become lazy about this. Even me. So, some of the directors in our area are giving a small procedural penalty – two matchponts in a pair game if eight is top – when they are called because of a face-up lead out of turn. (Penalties like this for violation of correct procedure are authorized by Law 90.) Their hope is that they will give very few of these, because leading face-down will become the new Normal.

It's like wearing your seat belt. Don't do it because of the law. Do it because it's better for you.


