# Bright Leaf Sectional Only a Few Weeks Away!

The tournament committee has been busy with preparations for the 2011 Bright Leaf Summer Sectional which will be held on July 7-10 at the Triangle Bridge Club in Durham. Some new enhancements this year should make it another enjoyable Unit 191 tournament.

Thirteen events for players of all levels. Separate open and 299er games for all events including Swiss teams on Sunday. Novice and intermediate players can feel comfortable playing with others with similar experience. Bracketed Knockouts start Thursday evening and continue through Friday. No events on Friday evening.

**Pre-dealt boards** for all pairs events and **computerized score entry.** Games will start promptly and results will be available immediately afterwards. No waiting to see how you did. Time between sessions has been extended by 30 minutes. This will give you more time for lunch and to review your results from the first game. This will also give us the time to offer a 30 minute **novice/intermediate lesson between sessions** on Friday and Saturday.

Plenty of delicious food. Our members always provide a wonderful selection of snacks and refreshments for each session. On Friday, the "OnlyBurger" food truck will be selling juicy burgers between sessions, just outside the door at TBC - no need to fight the traffic to get lunch. On Sunday, the Swiss Team lunches will be provided by Panera Bread. A guide to nearby restaurants will be available as well for your between-sessions meals.

We're proud of and very happy for you!! Keep up the good work.

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As a reminder for our Future Life Masters (FLMs), the masterpoint requirements for achieving the rank of Life Master changed the first of January *last year*. One now must have a minimum of 500 points rather than 300 and those must include the required numbers of color points. A FLM who was active (that is whose dues were paid up) as of 12/31/09 was grandfathered at the 300 level *provided he/she remains active until he/she reaches the rank of Life Master*. One's dues paid-through date appears on the second line of the mailing label on the monthly ACBL Bulletin. ACBL sends to each member a first and then, if necessary, a second renewal bill so failing to keep one's dues current can be very costly for those who qualify for the grandfathering.

For those who joined ACBL 01/01/10 or later and those who have allowed their memberships to lapse, a new rank -- Advanced NABC Master -- has been established, the master point requirements for which are the same as those for Life Master at the previous

300 minimum -- at least 50 black, 50 silver, 25 red or gold/platinum, 25 gold/platinum -- no more than 100 of which can come from online play.

# Changes To The Unit 191 Mentoring Program Announced

Sign-Up Period Now Through August 20th

Now is the time to starting thinking about whether you would like to participate in our Unit's mentor/mentee program. This year the program will be co-chaired by Barbara Haskell and Sharon Crane. This program lost popularity last year, so a survey of participants was taken. The results brought to light some areas of concern that the chairs will be addressing in the coming year's program.

There was less participation in the special games on Saturday afternoons, and some suggested that play on weekends was difficult due to personal scheduling. Some of the mentees felt that they did not have enough non-competitive play with their mentors. Some of the mentors felt that they had put more effort into the program than their mentees. Overall, everyone enjoyed the program and mentees appreciated the guidance of more experienced players.

In light of the these findings, we have decided to make some changes for next year. First, we suggest that the mentor/mentee pairs commit to play together at least monthly. The limited games may be an excellent opportunity to play with less stress, but these pairs will not compete for master points (unless the mentor qualifies for these games). Second, the mentees will be expected to pay the entry fees for their mentors, as happens at most clubs. We will only schedule three special games (the first one will probably be a Tuesday afternoon in November), and the Board has generously offered to supply the food for all of them.

We hope that many of our past mentors will volunteer to share your time and expertise once again. Non-life masters can serve as mentors to beginning players, and we also hope that we will see some of you in the program again. Several players were both mentors and mentees, and we encourage and appreciate this level of enthusiasm. Only non-life master players who are members of Unit 191 are eligible to have assigned mentors. If you are willing to be a mentor, please get in touch with Barbara or Sharon.
