BE-4-YA

What in the world is BE-4-YA, you may ask. This acronym stands for Bridge Education for Youth Association. For a number of years, Unit 191 has sponsored a Youth Bridge Camp in the first part of the summer to foster bridge education for the younger generation – the future of this great game we love. The cost to an attendee is a modest \$75 per week, which covers lunch, snacks, sports equipment for breaks, handouts, lessons, and rent for the camp facilities. Our teaching staff and helpers are all strictly volunteers; no one is paid. The Unit has underwritten the Youth Bridge program by paying for advertising, subsidizing food and snack expenses, and any costs for the youth not covered by the registration fees. While not operating totally on a shoestring, we have been close to doing so in our efforts to make bridge camp more affordable for parents with many options for summer youth programs. We would like to be able to spend more on promoting Youth Bridge Camp. We would like to offer scholarships to families who may not be able to afford to send their children to bridge camp. We would like to introduce a bridge program into the school system. All these efforts require extra revenue.

Accordingly, we have incorporated our Youth Bridge program as the not-for-profit organization, BE-4-YA. By doing so, anyone, regardless of whether they are a bridge player or an ACBL member, can be a member of BE-4-YA. Members support the Youth Bridge program in our area as volunteers — no one is paid — promoting and participating in Youth Bridge Camp, and by a small annual membership fee of \$18. We have been granted status as a tax exempt organization from the state of North Carolina, and await a determination from the IRS. If granted, BE-4-YA can receive tax –exempt donations. ACBL allows a certain number of Charity Games each year. Half of these games can support local charities, from which \$1 per each person playing in these games is given to the charity. Chris Moll and Triangle Bridge LLC have pledged a reasonable percentage of the local charity games at Triangle Bridge to BE-4-YA. We can also receive individual donations and hope many of you will support our youth bridge association BE-4-YA.
