

YOU CAN COPE WITH MICHAEL'S

Once upon a time, those pesky opponents interfered in MY auction with a Michaels Cue Bid! The unmitigated gall! My partner opened 1 Spade, my RHO bid 2 Spades, and, at this point, I didn't know what any of our bids meant. Fast forward with me about 50 years, and I can tell you the best way to counteract these space stealing scoundrels.

First off, let's bid the easy one. 1 Spade - 2 Spades (Michaels) - Double by you is an application of Stolen Bid. The opponent stole your 2 Spade bid. Lots of bridge players use this tool with regard to interference over their partner's NT bid, but I'm finding that many do not realize that you can do the same thing over partner's major suit bids too. The double should show 6-9 points and 3-4 Spades.

Next up, what is the auction 1 Spade - 2 Spades (Michaels) - 3 Spades by you. Following along logically, it should show Limit Raise values (10-11) points and 3-4 Spades. It is not forcing, but it is invitational.

How about 1 Spade - 2 Spades (Michaels) - 4 Spades? This one is a little trickier, but is still quite logical. It either shows 5 Spades and your God given good looks, or it is a hand with 12-14 junky points and does not invite any further bidding by partner unless he has quite a good hand.

Finally, as the cherry on top, what do you bid with a hand that is better than 14 points and might produce a slam if partner has the right cards?

Why, you strike a blow back at the PO's (pesky opponents) and Cue bid their suit at the 3 level. So, 1 Spade - 2 Spades (Michaels) - 3 Hearts says nothing about Hearts, but tells partner that you have a Spade fit (3 or more) and have aspirations for bigger things if he is agreeable. Does it promise a Heart control? NO! Does it ask for a stopper? NO! It just shows support for your suit and says that there might be bigger fish to fry than a mere game.

Let me give you a hand that I encountered at the TBC. RHO opened 1 Spade and going into PO mode, I bid 2 Spades. My LHO held the following hand:

S... Axx

H... xx

D... AQTx

C... AQTx

He bid 4 Spades and secretly hoped that his partner did not hold much. His partner held the following strong minimum:

S... KQTxx

H... Ax

D...J9x

C...Kxx

Not any extras, but a good looking hand in the context of knowing that partner held true extra values. If responder had cuebid 3H, playing the methods that I have just described, opener could cuebid the A of Hearts, letting partner know that he was interested.

Blackwood would reveal that they had enough Key cards plus the trump Q, and a contract of 6 Spades should be reached. After the K of Hearts opening lead, he could win the A and pull trumps. There were 4 Spades to the J on their right, but this was negotiable.

Now for the best part of the hand: declarer could play on both minors to see if he had a pitch for his losing Heart. A Club to the Q, then a Club to the K would let them pick up J fifth on his left. When this didn't work, he could switch horses and run the 9 of Diamonds followed by the J of Diamonds. This would work much better, as he could now pick up the Diamond K and make 7 on the hand. If RHO had held singleton K of Diamonds, he would have been VERY unlucky and gone down one.

Give these methods a try. I think that they will improve your overall bidding, and I know that they will improve your slam bidding.

FROM THE WEB

There are many sources of information for bridge these days. Here are 2 sites I found recently:

CARD PLAY: The Bridge Base Online website is previewing their next generation software. Use this link http://www.bridgebase.com/intro/preview.php and login. On the next screen, the Play or Watch area now has access to ALL of the Bridge Master deals. from Beginner to Expert sections there are now 30-40 deals per section. There used to be only 6 per section. Play out the hands and if you don't get it right the first time you can redeal and try again, or just read the analysis of the best line of play. Seeing how others view the play of the hand is very educational.

CONVENTIONS: Do you play Jacoby 2NT? How do you go about slam evaluation after Jacoby 2NT? What are some of the pitfalls? This article on the bridgewinners website has links to multiple variations https://bridgewinners.com/article/view/jacoby-2nt/

From an Alert in 2009—Peggy has changed very little.

Peggy is a legend in our unit. Excerpts from an article about her written in 2009:

"Peggy first played bridge at the Barfield Center in Northgate Park, a facility operated by the city Parks and Recreation Department. They played progressive bridge, but it was a social bridge club, not duplicate. The Barfield Bridge Club met on Tuesday nights and the top scorer won a 5-pound bag of sugar. Director Sam Brockwell gave S&H green stamps to winners. The Barfield Bridge Club and Durham Bridge Club merged and a Thursday night game, played at the Forest Hills Club House on University Drive, was added. They played only duplicate bridge at Forest Hills. The Forest Hills site was not available during the summer when games were held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church were the rent was only \$20 a week.

In the 1940s a duplicate game cost only 50 cents but by the 1950s the fee had risen to \$1.00. Winners were awarded 0.08 to 0.10 points for winning.

Peggy contributed in many ways to the success of Unit 191—she has directed, coordinated, planned, taught, chaired, presided, organized and done whatever is necessary to take care of business."

33% GOLD and 67% RED master points will be awarded for players finishing in the overalls of Gold Rush Pair events and Gold Rush Bracketed Swiss events. Players who place first in either direction of a two-session Pairs event also receive 33% GOLD. If a player is first in either direction of a side game, AND they play at least two games in the same series, 33% of the points will be GOLD. Additional GOLD may be earned by players in the side series overalls.
