What is a finesse?

- A finesse is when you have the choice to play at least two cards of non-sequential value from a suit, eg. The Ace and Queen
- The result of the choice can score you an extra trick, depending on where the missing high cards are.
- There are a wide variety of different times when a finesse can be used.
- Today we'll look at what those situations are, and whether or not it's correct to finesse, because it's <u>not always</u> right to do so.
