President's Welcome

The meeting was called to order by Vicki Willis. President of District 10 at 5:45pm. All attendees were asked to go around the room and introduce themselves and state the Unit that they are representing.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed by Judy Knox. The minutes from our last Board meeting in Birmingham, Alabama were distributed to all Unit Representatives. Ed Davis made a motion to approve the minutes. Second by Larry Sealy. The motion passed and the minutes were approved

Treasurer's Report - Pat Williams

Pat Williams, District 10 Treasurer gave the Treasurer's report for 2018. Pat walked us through all of the financial reports. (See Exhibit "A" which is attached for a copy of Pat's report.) Pat also stated that due to an error in transferring from the prior District 10 treasurer to him, our tax returns have not been filed for the last 3 years. We have lost our non-profit status. There is a procedure he has gone through to get it re-instated. This is a fairly normal task and does happen occasionally. If approved it will be retroactively applied and no taxes will be owed by the District.

Russ Jones - ACBL - BOD

Russ discussed Current ACBL Membership, district 10 membership, Club table count and Pianola among other things. Motions that passed and failed from the Fall 2018 ACBL Board meeting are also on page 2 of Russ's report. Please see Exhibit "B" for details of Russ's discussion.

Tournament Coordinator Report - Charles MacCracken

Swiss Qualifying for Bracketed KOs

In Birmingham our Board passed a requirement that all D-10 regionals held between March 1, 2019 and March 1, 2020 have at least one qualifying Swiss for a KO on the first day of a two - day event and a final of four teams that will play two sessions of KO to determine 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place. There is no overall award for the Swiss.

Several locations around the ACBL have tried this format. One location got a good turnout for the first one, but the comments were all poor and for the second one ('they hated it; the first day was a waste of their time').

D-7 and D-9 use a modified version. Just the top bracket uses general elimination (usually an RR) and the remaining teams are bracketed as usual. The comment was 'the teams ranked 7th, 8th & 9th in MPs and who would usually be in the top bracket loved it, but the general feeling was neutral.

D-4 and D-6 report neutral responses to the event.

I suggest treading cautiously when scheduling this event at your regionals. When you do run them, I urge you to make the second day a Bracketed Swiss for the non-qualifiers (the report below extols the virtues of Bracketed Swiss Teams).

Bracketed Events

Bracketed events are popular because they group the field in similar MP holdings. Simple logic shows that the more brackets, the narrower the MP gap between the top and bottom contestants. The converse is true. Having three-session KOs limits the spread.

I went to the Dallas and Houston Regionals this year. Dallas is of a similar size to Tunica, but Houston is twice as big. All five D-16 Regionals run seven days of Bracketed Swiss Teams (Sunday is A/X with a Bracketed B Swiss). In Dallas they accounted for over 50% of the prime-time attendance for the first three days and close to 60% for the next three (62% on the sixth day!). Dallas scheduled zero KO teams. The Ft. Worth Regional was similar to Dallas, except the Swiss was over 60% every day.

Houston Swiss Teams started with only 47% of the turnout on first day, but averaged well over 60% on the next five (67% on the sixth day). It had five KO teams scheduled. The first one had six tables. The others did not make. Similarly, Austin had two KOs scheduled, but neither made. Their Swiss Teams started slowly at about 40% the first two days, but built up to 50% quickly and ended with 59% on the sixth day.

It has taken Texas a number of years for the Swiss to reach this level of popularity. With 7, 8 or 9 team brackets the Swiss creates less of an MP spread. Plus, playing 6-8 board matches alleviates the tedium of playing a team that out classes yours. Adopting Bracketed Swiss Teams will not be a quick fix to our attendance problems. I suggest planning on three years before you really see results.

New Convention Chart Regulations

We will be governed by new convention regulations starting with Honolulu this fall. We have no options. The Basic and Basic+ are for relatively inexperienced players and will not show much change. They say what is allowed. The two Open charts are the exact opposite. They say what is disallowed! That leaves it very open ended. Players need to carefully read the next two issues of the Bulletin to familiarize themselves with the methods that can be used against them.

If your Unit is interested in a Non-Life Master Regional, please get your applications in before Christmas 2018. 3 Units will be selected for 2021.

GNT/NAP coordinator - Jerry Burford

At the last Board Meeting Pat Williams made a motion That there be a committee appointed by the President to be chaired by Jerry Burford to explore increasing participation in both the NAP and GNT Team Games. The motion passed. Jerry discussed ways we can improve attendance for these games. Jerry suggested sending out inquiries to see who would be interested in on-line participation for the open games. There would have to be a monitor present for the entire on-line game. This could be a problem. Get clubs better informed on Unit Qualifying games and have better district finals. If not on-line, we can incorporate with flight A, B& C games in Jackson, MS. Cannot have it opposite Gatlinburg. The conditions of Contest should be updated and put on line. There is no Unit Qualification for NAP. You can qualify at the club level for NAP. However, you have to qualify at the Unit level for GNT Swiss. Dates for having GNT Unit Qualifying Swiss Team games is Oct. 1 to end of March, 2019. COC should go out to all Unit Presidents in District 10 in January, 2019.

BOD Report

Fall 2018

Membership – Stands at 166,700, which is down 100 from last year at this time. There were 6,200 new members added this year which is an increase of 4% over last year. However, there were more losses by death and non-renewal than the previous year. 844 new temporary memberships of which 172 renewed for a full year.

<u>Club Table Count</u>- Club F2F tables were down 2.4% while club online games were steady. During the first six months of 2018, total club game count was 1.3M of which 400,000 were online. Special event participation was up 55% this year.

<u>Finance</u> – 2018 budget predicted a \$152K budget loss. Currently, at \$42k ahead of budget. There is also a \$375k write-off expected due to a filed CRM project. Currently, HQ employs 60 while the field employs 160 on a full-time basis.

<u>Technology</u> – Club games engine under beta testing and expected to be released in March, 2019. AS400 redundancy project moving ahead.

<u>Tournament Tables</u> – Regional count is down 6% from this time last year with two fewer regionals. Sectional table count is steady with 16 less sectionals. STAC count is down 7% with two fewer STACS held. Total count is down 9.4% with 20 fewer tournaments being help.

<u>Pianolo – Change of service agreement and district/unit usage guidelines.</u>

<u>Marketing Programs – LBIAD</u>, Lifelong Learning at universities, Youth NABC, Coop advertising, It's Your Call, and Longest Day (over \$1M in 2018).

<u>District 10</u> – Currently we have 6,500 members, the 10^{th} largest district. We have been relatively stable in members over the past 5 years with a high of 6.720. We have experienced a loss of under 26 members during the last 5 years.
