COMMON MISTAKES IN DEFENSE:

1. Leading Aces
2. Looking for ruffs with good trump holding
3. Failing to lead trump
4. Always returning partner's opening lead
5. Failing to use suit preference
6. Jumping up with aces
7. Do not underlead aces at trick 1

DISCRADS: Signal on your first discard to talk to partner, keep same length as dummy.
 When you discard an honor, it's top of touching (QJ1092). Giving partner information doesn't demand a switch, it lets partner know what you have.
