COMMON MISTAKES IN DEFENSE:

- Leading Aces
- 2. Looking for ruffs with good trump holding
- 3. Failing to lead trump
- 4. Always returning partner's opening lead
- 5. Failing to use suit preference
- 6. Jumping up with aces
- 7. Do not underlead aces at trick 1

DISCRADS: Signal on your first discard to talk to partner, keep same length as dummy. When you discard an honor, it's top of touching (QJ1092). Giving partner information doesn't demand a switch, it lets partner know what you have.
