Identify and count your losers. When the trump suit is unevenly split between declarer and dummy, count losers from the longer trump hand – usually declarer's hand.

K of spades lead. Think of the 4 suits as follows:

- 1. Trump suit, draw as many as necessary
- 2. The "DON'T TOUCH SUIT", want the opponents to lead it, identify this suit at the beginning of play, so you don't play it yourself.
- 3. The "STRIP SUIT" play it in its entirety, remembering to ruff if necessary. Both hands strip this suit.
- 4. EXIT SUIT you play to throw the opponents in.

Plan your timing, which suit should be played first? Is drawing trumps the top priority? Is drawing trumps the top priority? Are there entry problems? Can you afford to lose the lead?
