

REBIDS BY OPENER

As opener, your 2nd bid is an important part of describing your hand to partner. The first step in choosing a rebid is identifying whether your hand is balanced or unbalanced.

Example: J A8754 K543 Aj3, you open 1 Heart, partner bids 1 spade, your rebid is 2 diamonds, non- forcing and unbalanced. A 1 NT rebid would be 12-14 H.C.P. balanced.

Your rebid tells partner exactly what sort of opener you have, minimum, strong, long suit, 2 suited, support for partner's response. With a minimum, limit your hand promptly.

Always plan a second bid before you choose the first.

1 Diamond by you, 1 Heart or 1 Spade by partner, 2 NT by you (rebid) shows 18-19 balanced.

1 Hearts or 1 Spade by you, 2 hearts or 2 spades by partner, a new suit by you (rebid) is a Help Suit Game Try.

Rebid was 1 NT, 3 clubs, Limit raise in clubs with 4 hearts, bid game with 14 HCP.
5 of diamonds lead, you're declarer, plan your play.

The 1 NT rebid is remarkably descriptive, showing all of the following:

- A minimum opener (12-14 HCP)
- A balanced hand (no singletons)
- No 4 card heart support (raise to 2 hearts with 4 hearts)
- No 4 card spade suit (must bid 1 spade with 4 of them)

South should pass 2 hearts because North could have jumped, bid a new suit, (or used New Minor Forcing) with any stronger hand. 2 Hearts makes 8 tricks, 1NT could well make 7 tricks.
