North's hand is fitting very well with South's – a good 4 card spade fit, Kx opposite South's Axxxx of diamonds, and 2 Aces opposite South's remaining 3 cards. Roman Keycard Blackwood shows South with 0 or 3 controls and North bids an easy 6 Spades.

NS have AKQ of hearts, 5 diamond tricks and 5 club tricks. That's 13 tricks and NS will make 7 NT unless East leads the Ace of spades. One point to note, when South makes a game forcing 2 Diamonds response, North might be tempted to jump to 3 NT even if he had 22-24 HCP. North should never do this because it will throw off South's arithmetic. With 22-24 always rebid 2 NT, (South's going to game). Only jump to 3 NT when you have 25-27.

North could bid NT with a spade stopper, rebid diamonds with a long suit or bid 3 clubs with clubs, on this hand North has 4 hearts and bids 3 Hearts. South Re-evaluates his hand and uses Roman Keycard Blackwood. Missing just 1 control, South bids 6 Hearts, and North loses just 1 spade trick.

With 10 HCP including 2 Aces, South definitely shouldn't pass, North has at least an opener, and may well have a stronger hand. North will know South doesn't have spade support but does probably have about 10 pts. Or more, otherwise South would pass 2 spades. North likes hearing the diamond bid and with a spade suit that doesn't need any support, makes an easy jump to 4 spades. North makes 5. WHEN AN OPPONENT PREEMPTS IN FRONT OF YOU, YOU DO NOT PREEMPT ON TOP OF THEM. If you bid over their preempt, you show a good hand.
