K of Clubs lead, win the Ace, lead a heart to hand, what next????

If your partner uses Jacoby 2 NT and your RHO bids a suit, double shows a singleton in that suit. Bidding another suit shows a singleton in that suit. Four of your major shows a minimum and pass shows extra with no singleton.

If RHO doubles partner's splinter, redouble by you shows first round control in the splinter suit, pass to show a minimum, cue bid with slam interest, or bid game, (to play).

Jacoby 2 NT is not on by a passed hand. Jacoby 2 NT is not on if the opponent interferes.

Splinters are on by a passed hand and also as LONG AS YOU CAN JUMP.

ANSWER to the last hand: when declarer has a singleton facing a K plus and another finesse available in a long suit, and declarer can afford to lose 1 trick – Lead the singleton first. If the Ace is well placed (on side), giving you a discard, It may mean no finesse will be necessary in the long suit.

TRICK 3, lead your singleton spade, pitch a diamond on the King of spades.

Interference over 2 clubs, DOUBLE shows no Ace of King (memory tip – double for nothing. PASS shows at least an Ace or King (Memory tip – pass is positive).
