Checkback Stayman by Barbara Seagram

Checkback Stayman is a nifty convention which is used most commonly after an opening bid of one of a minor and then a one of a major response with the opening bidder then jumping to 2 NT. There are different treatments and different titles for this convention, so it requires partnership discussion.

1 ♦ - 1 ♥

2 NT - 3♣ by responder is now Checkback Stayman

Why are we doing this??

The opening bidder may also have a four-card other major suit **OR** may have 3-card support for the responder's 5-card major.

Let's have a look at above auction again: 1 D - 1 ♥

2 NT - **3♣**

Responses to $3 \clubsuit$ are as follows:

3 ♦ says: I don't have 3-card support for your major suit (♥) & I don't have 4 cards in the other major.

3 v says: I have 3 card support for your v suit but I do NOT have 4 spades.

3♠ says: I have a 4 card ♠ suit but do not have 3 card support for your ♥ suit.

3NT says: I have both 3-card support for ♥ and also a four card ♠ suit.

Now let's check out the other major suit situation:

Responses to 3. are as follows:

3 ♦ says: I do not have 3 card support for your major suit (♠) nor do I have 4 cards in the other major (♥)

3♠ says: I have 3 card support for your ♠ suit but I do NOT have 4 hearts.

3♥ says: I have a 4 card ♥ suit but do not have 3 card support for your ♠ suit.

3 NT says: I have both 3-card support for ♠ and also a four card ♥ suit.

The only time you would ever use this convention is if you have 4-4 in the majors or you have 4-5 in the majors or you have one five card major.

The responder now places the contract, equipped with more information about opener's hand.

Let's look at two situations in which it would be useful to be playing Checkback Stayman:

Note that if NS was not playing Checkback Stayman, North would have now bid 3NT after South's jump to 2 NT. If the opening lead was a ♣, then South would never be able to make 3NT. He would have to drive out the A ♥ and then EW would be able to cash 4♣ tricks quickly. 4♠ is an easy contract.

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North can easily make 4♠ but 3NT by South is doomed on a ♦ opening lead by West.

Checkback Stayman is alertable as are all the responses. You need to have enough points to be in game in order to use this convention.

We never want to miss an eight - card major suit fit. Remember that it is always much safer to play the hand in a major suit contract than in No trumps.

This deal was used in an intermediate class on play. The bidding was designated to be the same at every table, as was the lead – the nine of hearts.

At one table, the heart was covered by the queen, king, and ace. Declarer drew trumps with his king and dummy's ace then led a club from dummy. The defenders took two clubs and had to make a diamond trick: four spades making.

At a second table, the nine of hearts was again covered by the queen but, here, East was cannier, playing the two of hearts. Then declarer had to lose two clubs and two diamonds for a one-trick set.

The correct play was found at a third table. Declarer played the four of hearts from dummy at trick one. After taking his ace of hearts, declarer drew trumps with the king and queen then played his remaining heart to dummy's ten and East's king. East's continuation of the queen of clubs was covered by the king and ace. After winning the club continuation with the ten, East shifted to the ten of diamonds. Declarer won with the ace and crossed to dummy with a trump to the ace to throw his losing diamonds on the queen and jack of hearts.
