





Comments (15)

- Probably 1 game every 3 weeks during the season
- But a 10 match pattern makes for too few games
- Prefer 6 to 7
- Maybe 6 - 8 matches per season would be preferred
- Playing twice per month would be OK but it seems that games concentrate in the month before the end of the first half and the final month. To play 5 games in 6 weeks effects attendance at the club night.
- I think a max of about 8 matches.
- Slightly too many.
- 10
- I think a maximum of 10 matches works well.
- 6 to 8 but no more
- 10 is fine, 12 is slightly too many. With B&B league of 8 it is slightly hard to rearrange fixtures to complete by Easter.
- Prefer a small reduction to around 9-10.
- Matches need to be played in a more timely fashion
- Half the number - just home or away. ie. don't play the same team twice.
- I would prefer around 5 to 6 matches (just one per team) - the issues is that too few of us are playing in more and more of the events and time is limited

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

Comments (11)

- Prefer the current 12 match pattern
- Home and away dont really matter as home matches are sometimes played away as venue hosts allow. Playing once would imply more teams of a wider range of abilities. Fewer teams would mean a closer match.
 - Another alternative would be 2 divisions of 10 & one match against each.
 - But promotion/relegation needs amendment to have only 1 up/1 down
 - Over the many years I've played in the league, it's generally the case that teams promoted to the 1st division struggle, see Woodley this year. If there were, say, 3 more teams in the 1st div that were likely to be of a lower calibre than Woodley, then they are likely to be hammered in at least half their matches.
 - I think playing home and away against each team is important because it is often one or two hands that can swing a result. If you reduce the number of teams in a Division you will need to consider adding another Division to cater for the overall interest in the League.
 - I would much, much prefer one match against each team in divisions increased to 8-10 teams.
 - There were only six teams in Division 1, including three from one club. I don't think reducing the number of teams and playing each other twice would work very well at all.
 - I prefer the two legged matches, as it provides for more opportunity to play against similar teams. It also removes any "home advantage".
 - Reducing the number of teams in a division is probably the easier option.
 - Would not support a reduction in fixtures



 - With April as spill over

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



- Club venue is fine too, I have also played at another friends house too when we didn't have a home venue




- I still work
