With 9+ HCP (8+ if response was 1NT) Bids 2 of lowest unbid suit if Opener shows a natural bid by rebidding his major, or 2nt over a opening. Any other bid is FG
With fewer Gives normal preference, rebids suit or raises clubs.
Any further bid by opener is GF.
2. Good/bad 2NT applies if:
a. Our 1 NT is overcalled;
b. Opener can't rebid his suit at the 2 level due to intervention;
c. Opposite a double of Multi, Weak two or two suited 2 level opener, or doubled suit raised to 2
