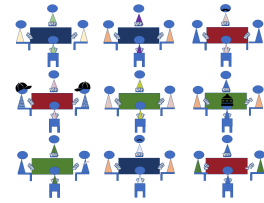

Youth Bridge

What do we expect/hope for from Youth Bridge?

There are two aspects of youth bridge, that are very different, and both very important.

Firstly there is elite youth bridge, where young players of extraordinary ability compete at a national and international level.

Secondly there is bridge in school and university. We need to introduce students to the game with a view to their enjoyment of the game as a leisure activity. In particular hoping they may play for a while, PERHAPS have to drop out when career and family absorb their time, but return to bridge in later life.

A Round Up of Youth Bridge Activity

Interschools league held on RealBridge between October and Easter. Run by Stuart Haring of Habs boys which is the school with the largest entry. Results on EBU Home Page, Youth, League results.

Started in 2021-22 season. This years winners St Pauls, 2nd Habs Prize- Lords Trophy presented at the House of Lords along with a tour , match and tea. Cancelled this year since the building is closed until after the election!

Grand Prix series. Consists of 6 events, entries and running results on bridge4schools. 3F2F at youth camps and 3 online on RealBridge. Started in 2021-22 season Last online one on 30th June- register on B4S to give it a try ready for next year.

Bridge camps. Spring Cheltenham(ladies college and bridge club), Summer Northants(Kings Park conference centre), Autumn Woldingham School Surrey. Everyone enjoys them and makes enormous strides. Financial help is available so that everyone who wants to come can-just ask. Flier attached for the next one. Google the Kings Park Conference centre for more details

Generation Game Started in December 2023 with 2T. Now running monthly with 3-4T minibridge and 7-8T bridge. Aimed at family bridge and started by 2 grannies who live some distance from their grandchildren. One granny from Norfolk is playing with her 3 grandchildren in Toronto.

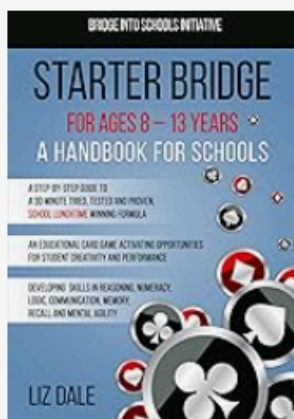
Schools cups. National schools championship- March Loughborough, Herts cup. November Habs boys, Surrey Schools cup. Feb. All teams of 4 events -very inclusive since there are several levels to choose from. All 3 attract an entry of approximately 100 juniors.

Weekend clubs. These are run at Acland Burghley (North London), Cheltenham, Oxford, Witney and York with others in the pipeline

What about the future of Youth Bridge?

The elite youth teams are in good shape. Some wonderful people are producing some amazing players.

There are many people delivering in schools up and down the country. However it's patchy and dependent on individuals taking an interest in particular schools. We need a national programme. We need to encourage, learn from and share best practice among those teaching in schools.

Bridge in Universities has declined sharply. We need a

programme to rebuild it. This could include sponsoring students to run university bridge clubs.

Almost everyone associated with EBED (the charity English Bridge Education and Development) is new. The new trustees announced on their website that they have met to discuss the future. They now have a wonderful legacy to invest,. We hope to hear their plans soon.

Five goals for the EBU in 2024

These were set after the November 2023 EBU AGM to address the low public profile of bridge and the aging and declining numbers of players.

SEPTEMBER Update

1 EBU Member Numbers - Reverse the Decline

Let's see this deficit get smaller in 2024

It is now **TEN** months since it emerged, that in the year to Nov 2023 there was a 3.000 net loss in membership.

Overall player membership of the EBU is down from 55,000 to 50,000 in four years.

However, fewer players are playing more often, This means UM income to the EBU has stabilised, possibly leading to less focus on player numbers within the EBU organisation.

BUT

The average age player members is estimated at 74, If they have an average of ten years playing life left, and they are not replaced there will be none in ten years. No UMS. No EBU.

SEPTEMBER Update

Membership numbers will be provided to shareholders at the November AGM. It will be possible to do a direct comparison between last years numbers and this years numbers.

Frequent players - UM2 (players playing more than 12 times in the year) may be steady. The EBU has told us that regular players are playing more. This keeps up the UM income, but is very worrying for the future of the game.

Occasional players - UM1 (players playing 1-12 times in the year) will tell us if these players are returning(?) to bridge. We might see a rise attributable to BIABD here.

Members of Affiliated clubs not playing in Affiliated Events - UM0 saw a major fall recently, probably because clubs updated their EBU account membership list to reflect players not expected to return after the pandemic. However this category also contains club members taking only lessons or playing only in supervised/mentored/coached play. The decline should be much reduced now, and any increase should reflect new players to the game.

The EBU has the data to analyse the movement of known members between these groups which could be informative.

Aylesbury is unsighted as to numbers of learners in lessons and coaching. Perhaps some thought to its relationship with teachers would enable analysis. Recruitment of new players needs to be the top priority for all of us who want the game to be healthy in ten or twenty years time, even if we are not there to see it.

We urge the board to have a strategy to collect better data and use it to manage an increase in new players at grass roots level.



2 The Annual General Meeting - more open, more democratic

Let's have a better format in 2024.

The AGM reverted to Face to face in a London hotel. Representatives from counties some distance from London faced more expense and travelling time. Many resorted to proxies. The meeting was only open to shareholders and their proxies, no public, no press, no playing members, no representatives of clubs, teachers or other bridge organisers. It was not recorded, so the record of the proceedings is limited to formal minutes and informal notes and discussions.

The chair undertook to look at a hybrid online and face to face form with electronic real time voting. This would allow a far greater audience, more participation, and a recording easily made widely available.

A London hotel has been booked for the 2024 AGM. It is has been noted that there is no need for a Hybrid online/F2F meeting. No change to the "rule" that only shareholders or their proxies may attend.

NO PROGRESS

In fact documented decision not to change.

SEPTEMBER Update

The board have announced that there will be a hybrid format in November, with Zoom included. This is great. We look forward to hearing a bit more detail.



3 Updates from Aylesbury - radically improve, energise and push

Any member able to request this newsletter by opting for it in their member account.

That way more people can be informed about bridge organisation.

The monthly update from Aylesbury is largely used as a vehicle for marketing EBU run events. However, it can contain information important to club and county organisers, and of interest to teachers and players.

At present, the EBU sends to its own distribution list of club and county officials. It is difficult to keep this list up to date.

It would be so good if the EBU could adopt a policy of actively informing and educating about bridge, especially organising bridge. You have to persist in searching the web site for so many things, or directly request access from individuals. It would be so much more powerful if any member can subscribe or unsubscribe from a complete and dynamic list of interests e.g. events, teaching, directing etc.

There's no progress here. This would be an issue that I would want to tackle urgently. I know from years of running this newsletter just how poorly members, players, club organisers etc are informed. I am sure this constricts the flow of volunteers to help.

July - We are going to have to do this ourselves. See above.

SEPTEMBER Update

There has been a shift in the content of "Updates from Aylesbury". There's been less focus on promotion of EBU events. There has been information about upcoming proposed changes to EBU governance

documents and even a programme for consultation.

However, to read this monthly communication, you have to either be a registered county or club official, or know that it is available and seek out the area on the EBU website where you can request to receive it.

This is true of much EBU/EBED information, for example, master point scheme news, changes to regulations, youth bridge. Most of it is quite difficult to find, there is much room for improvement in the menu structure. Communication needs to be increased in quality, currency and accessibility. All players need to be able to easily access what they need to know and select regular updates on topics that interest them.



4 EBU Teachers Directory - Landing point for learners

There were about 200 entries in February. With wide publicity, let's double this number in 2024.

This directory is used by the EBU to pass on enquiries for lessons. Any teacher can be on the directory. It's not limited to EBEDTA members, or to those who use particular materials, systems or methods. It has real potential to boost numbers learning the game. Teachers put themselves into the directory.

Regrettably the count on 2nd March was still 200 entries. There were an additional six entries in the directory as of 10th May.

This is an area the EBU should be using all channels to promote. This directory has the potential to be the "landing page" for all people looking to learn bridge. This is key to recruiting new bridge players.

The EBU could promote it in:

All EBU members email

All Club/County organisers email (Updates from Aylesbury)

By agreement with EBED to EBTA members

JULY UPDATE We were told this directory is going to be merged with EBEDTA. Hopefully no restrictions on who can be listed will be introduced. More hopefully some effort will be made to further grow the number of entries. THEN some effort at national PR to attract potential learners to it would be lovely.

AUGUST UPDATE No visible progress here despite the closeness of the September/October course starts. Any chance of a plan for January?

SEPTEMBER Update

Entries in the directory have risen to 246. There is still no sign of the merger with the membership of the "teachers' club" EBEDTA, with over 500 entries? Could this be sorted for the January student intake??



5 Freeze UM - Reduce Affiliated Costs to Clubs

Freeze UM in 2025/26 to reduce financial pressure on clubs.

UM is a cost of doing business for affiliated clubs. The level of EBU plus County UM has reached about 50p per player per qualifying session.

Table money is generally £2, £2.50 or £3. The median is £2.50. That means the EBU UM is 20%. Clubs have venues, and various other expenses to meet.

There is no official response to this idea. Informally, the comment is that the EBU don't see how they can afford it.

During enquiries we made before the 2023 AGM, it emerged that the Aylesbury building has been valued at £1.1M. There is over a million pounds of shareholders money invested in a building that is clearly too big.

The EBU Board lost it's treasurer and has supported a director with no financial experience to stand in until November. (The board has

appointed another of its directors with no financial experience as EBED treasurer). There is no sign of active management of the finances to make possible a UMS freeze.

JULY UPDATE Hopefully the EBU is intending to reduce the financial burden on clubs by freezing rather than the usual rather automatic increase.

AUGUST Update

There was a consultation earlier this about changing the structure of UMS. Read about it here - a post on EBU Forum by David Guild <https://forums.ebu.co.uk/discussion/1554/change-to-ums-fees-structure>

I think there was an announcement that the idea was dropped. Please could the EBU consider a consistent process, as widely publicised as possible, for consultations of this nature. It will improve the quality and the acceptance of the outcome.

SEPTEMBER Update

The board will be putting together the budgets for 2025/26. There are three main income streams: Bridge Warehouse sales; Tournament Fees and UM (P2P). The margins on the first two are small. UM contributes the surplus that cover Aylesbury overheads. It is very easy for the board to simply keep raising UM in line with these costs. However, this will not help hard pressed clubs to survive - or to remain affiliated.

We urge the board to control their costs and hold UM at 2024/25 levels.

How are clubs doing?

Player Numbers

The number of clubs in the database has risen to 883. (736 active).
The number of club face to face sessions noted on all 861 is 1,335.

56 clubs revisited during the last fortnight. Most of them were reviewed well over a year ago. Sadly there were another handful that ceased playing, but a few new active clubs were added. Table money was increased at some clubs, but many kept it at previous levels.

Starting to review table numbers for a second time. Small sample so far, but table numbers seem unchanged, not growing, but not falling.

The number of club sessions analysed in detail is now 1639 from 700 clubs, but only 599 posted table numbers on their web site.

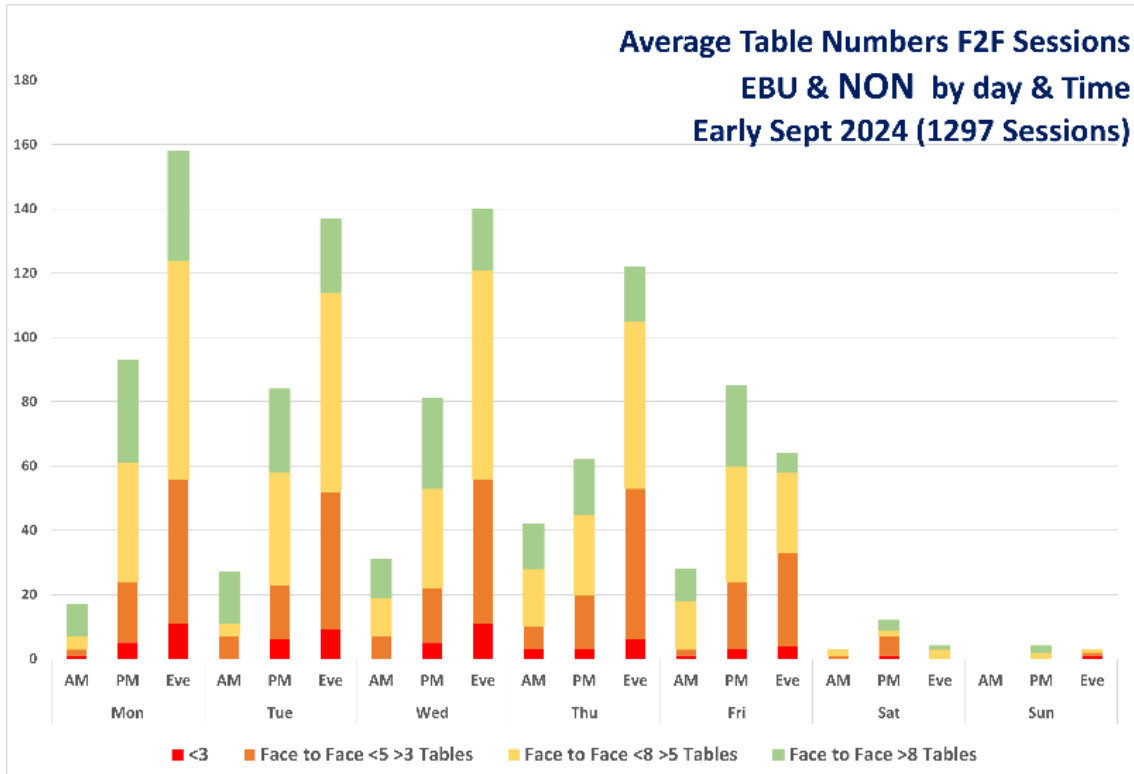
The detail captures day of week, time of day and the average number of tables in the last three sessions.

Dormant and defunct clubs are forming a big section (3% and 13%), they are now being excluded from data about active clubs.

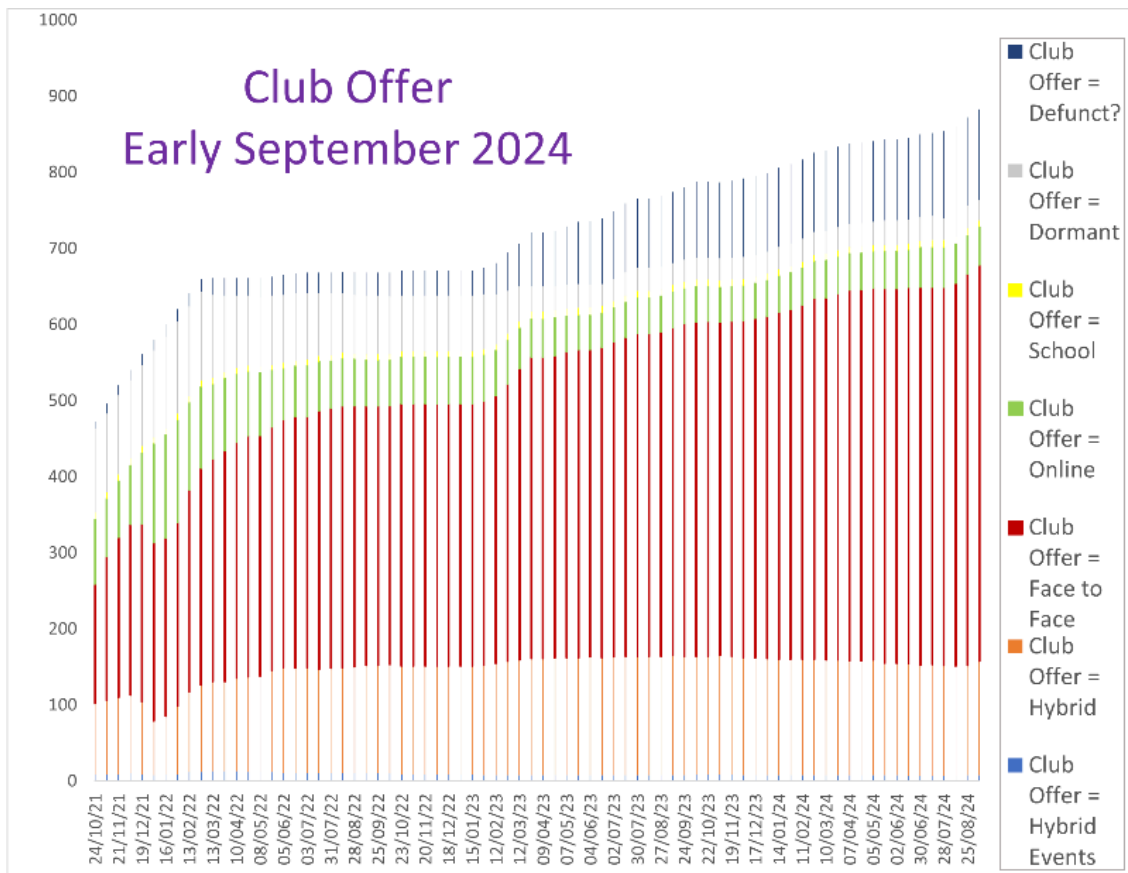
Weekday morning sessions, where offered, are popular!

The club offer proportions are steady. There is still a slight and steady rise in clubs offering Face to Face sessions only as opposed to offering online only, or a mixture of face to face and online.

Here's how face to face and online sessions are distributed across the week.

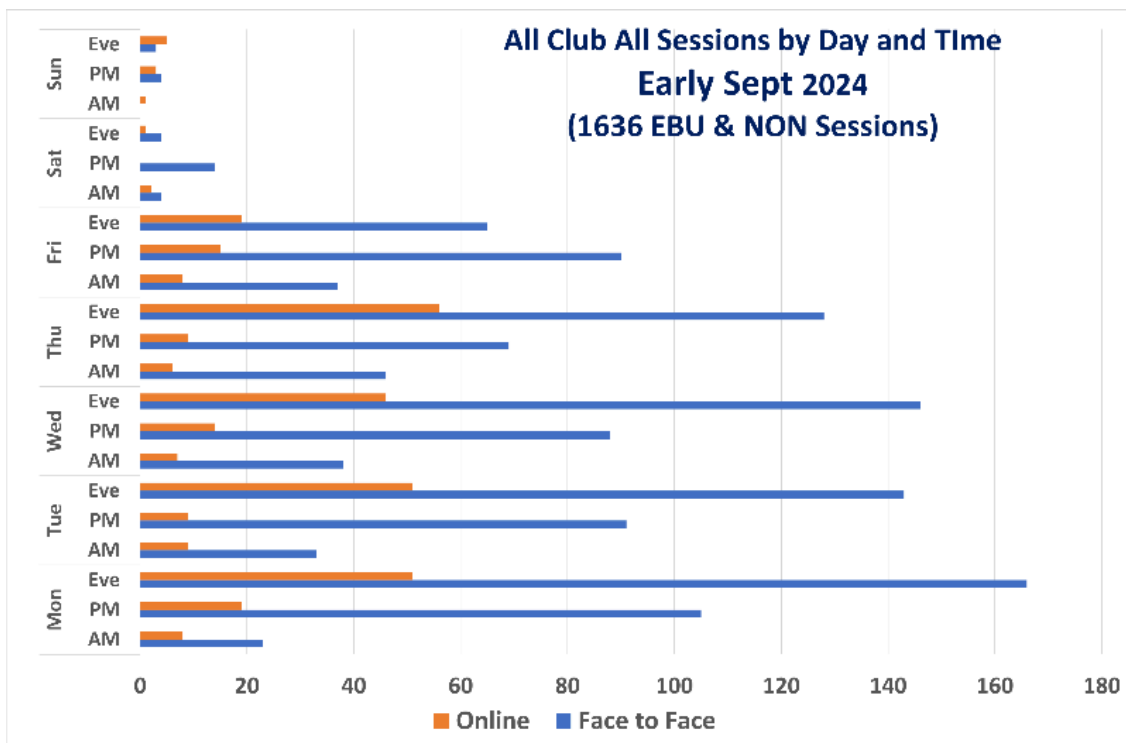


The thin blue band at the bottom represents clubs that offer both face to face and online and combine at least one session into a hybrid result.

Above it, the orange section represents clubs that offer both face to face and online sessions.

Of over 700 (roughly half EBU Affiliated) active clubs the majority are offering only face to face. That's the steadily growing red section.

The green belt above that shows clubs that are only offering online sessions. Most of these are quite small and are unable to persuade their members back into the bridge room.
