

Hand Summary BFP B1 L03 Opening 1 of a suit

	<p>All these hands are designed for a simple auction consisting of a bid of one of suit, then passed out. There's no need to go into 1NT opening requirements, as none of these hands would be opened 1NT. They are simply intended to give practice and build confidence at using the bidding boxes, very simple auctions and trump contract declarer and defence play. There are always points to be made about card play if the class is catching on fast.</p>
1	Ten HCPs all round, all hands are flat, designed to practice the passed out situation.
2	This hand has three passes, but then North opens 1S. All these hands are designed to then be passed out. Declarer can make 1S.
3	This hand has three passes, but then East opens 1H. All these hands are designed to then be passed out. Declarer can make 1H plus one overtrick.
4	West opens 1C. All these hands are designed to then be passed out. Declarer can make 1C.
5	Two passes to South, who opens 1H, make the point that with two five card suits, or two six card suits, best practice is to open 1 of the higher ranking suit.
6	Two passes to West who opens 1S. This should be followed by three passes. There should be eight tricks in spades.
7	Two passes to North who opens 1H. It's then passed out. North should not make 1H, but it was the correct bid. Not all correct bids succeed.
8	West opens 1H, 19HCP is the top of the 1 of a suit HCP range. It's passed out and Hearts makes 8 tricks. There's no game bid available because partner is so lacking in HCPs.
