HELPING TO RECRUIT NEW MEMBERS TO THE CLUB, BY GEOFF WILLIAMS

In the past 6 months, the committee has taken three initiatives to attract new members to the Club. We have advertised extensively in the area to encourage people who already play bridge, but not at an EBU club, to come along to our Club and take part in competitive bridge in a relaxed and enjoyable environment.

One thing we realised early on was that many bridge players were nervous about playing in a club, wondering whether their standard of bridge would be good enough, and whether they would be criticised if they got something wrong. They were also concerned that their opponents would be so competitive that they would not feel welcome.

This caused us to introduce an eight week programme, devised and led by Penny Moody, to introduce such players to the requirements of club bridge. This focused on topics such as bridge etiquette, alerting and announcing and pace of play, as well as bridge topics like leads, discards/signals and use of system cards.

The first of these programmes with 21 new members was completed at the beginning of July, and another programme starts on 9th September.

We realised during the first course that some players would need a little longer to practice before joining standard Club sessions. We have therefore introduced Supervised Play sessions, where people who felt that they weren't quite ready to play at the club, could have further practice, particularly to reach the required pace of play. These will run every Monday afternoon, and will allow people to seek advice from established Club members on how to bid or play particular hands.

CONVENTION CARDS

We are again asking each pair to comply with the request to have a convention card, at least one between each pair, on the table at all times. This is necessary, not only for your opponents' use, but also so that if the director is called to adjudicate on a problem and s/he has to decide on a fair result, your convention card may provide essential information

IN THE WRONG SEAT?

We have recently had several incidents of pairs playing the wrong boards or the wrong opponents. This can arise when a pair does not arrow switch as the table card directs. Our rules of etiquette require pairs to physically move position so as to minimize the risk of this happening.

Other cases have arisen because one or both pairs have sat down in the wrong position – at the wrong table, the wrong orientation, or both!

These errors affect the results of all pairs in that day's competition and are easily avoided. The new bridge tabs show at the end of each round where the two pairs move to next. Similarly, the next page shows which pairs should be playing at the table next, and whether N/S or E/W. It is the responsibility of both members of both pairs to ensure that they are sitting in the right place and playing the correct opponents.

This should have removed any excuses for getting it wrong. Therefore, with effect from 5th August onwards, the Director will apply the standard EBU penalty in such cases – 25% of a top.

Following on about scoring errors, many of you will be aware that during Friday 19th July's competition, there was a fouled board - two cards being switched between hands part way through the session - which proved a significant error and which resulted in scorers (Alan and Jim in particular) spending many hours over the weekend to produce a fair and accurate result. This is an example of how much time can be spent by scorers when members get things wrong, particularly in this case, when it was a competition event.

HOSTING/ATTENDANCE

At our last committee meeting, the committee was pleased to note that we had had more hosts in the 2nd quarter, hitting 91% of all sessions covered in April. It was agreed to ask that, ideally, members should try to volunteer to host 2 or 3 days ahead of the session, so that people have advance warning, although in the case of, say, a late cancellation by your partner, last minutes volunteers would still be welcomed.

It was also reported that, comparing the same period last year to this, average weekly attendances rose from 29.2 to 31.0 tables (+6.1%) per week. This is encouraging and is in part because of the increase of hosts whose help in keeping up attendance is very much appreciated.
