North shows 8-9 points with exactly 5 spades by transferring into 2 and rebidding 2NT. With a minimum hand and spade support South chooses the partscore contract in spades.

South's 5 card minor suit doesn't put him off opening 1NT, since his hand is essentially balanced. North shows his spades with $2 \checkmark$ and South dutifully completes the transfer by bidding $2 \spadesuit$. North isn't strong enough to bid again.

North invites game in spades by transferring to $2 \triangle$ and continuing with $3 \triangle$. With a minimum hand and only 2 spades South has no hesitation in passing.

South wants to sign off in diamonds, but can't do so by bidding 2^{\bullet} , since this would be a transfer, showing 5+ hearts. He therefore bids 2^{\bullet} , asking North to bid 3^{\bullet} . South continues with 3^{\bullet} , which is now a sign off

Note: some partnerships play a convention known as McKendrick, where the 2 response might also show exactly 8 points. Opener rebids 2NT with 15-16 and 3 with 17 points. On this hand the auction would be exactly the same. McKendrick is essentially a "cost nothing" adjunct to the weak takeout in a minor suit.

North shows game values and exactly 5 hearts by transferring to 2♥ and rebidding 3NT. With only two hearts South is happy to pass.
