Introduction

As a section of the Penylan club, the Bridge Club does not provide formal accounts, but this report enables CBC Members to understand what happened to the money they paid in 2022.

WBU Subscriptions

In addition to the income, CBC act as collectors for the Welsh Bridge Union (WBU) as all CBC members are required to be WBU members, so the money is passed directly to the WBU.

Competition Fees

Also, during the year CBC participates in several simultaneous events, organised by ECATS. The money collected by CBC is forwarded to the relevant Organisations, or to ECATS directly where they organise charity events.

Comments

Table money & Subscriptions: Subscriptions are down slightly. Table money has increased by approx. £2,000. Obviously, this represents a very welcome improvement in activity after the closure of the club forced on us by covid.

Provision of Courses: We revived our beginners' and intermediate courses this year and both attracted healthy numbers. This activity is quite profitable and, more importantly, is vital in attracting new members.

System & Director Charges were higher than in 2021 because of the inclusion of TD and Teachers' fees for Monday afternoons and Beginners courses.

Miscellaneous expenses The majority of costs here are associated with advertising and supplies for Beginners classes.

Consumable costs include the purchase of playing cards.

Summary

It has been a very difficult 3 years because of the impact of Covid 19. Unsurprisingly, membership numbers have dropped but not to the extent we might have expected. In the years 2020 to 2022, the section made a positive financial contribution towards the Club's general funds. A net contribution of over £15,000 in 2022 is a significant achievement in the circumstances.
