### **April STaC**

Chicago Duplicate Bridge is offering STaC—Sectional Tournament at the Clubs—games during the first week of the month—April 1 through 7. All F2F games that week will be part of the STaC. This is an opportunity to earn Silver points without going to an external tournament. These games are always well-attended and lots of fun. Join us!

#### Win Red and Gold Points at the Club!

In April we will host two unusual events where you can win those coveted Red and Gold points right at CDB. On Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup> (under the auspices of NU at CDB) and Friday the 19<sup>th</sup>, we will hold April Showers games, where all points awarded are 50% Red and 50% Black. And all week April 22<sup>nd</sup> through the 26<sup>th</sup> (plus the 28<sup>th</sup> at NU), all points awarded will be 25% Gold and 75% Black. The chance to win Gold points without going to a major tournament is very rare—only twice a year, and the next time is not until December.

### **Looking for a Fun, Unique Bridge Challenge?**

New-ish players, want to play with some of the most experienced players in the club? Advanced players, want to see if you can still win without all the special conventions? Then join us on the evening of Thursday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, when CDB will run an Individual event. This is a game for everyone regardless of skill level, and you don't need a partner. You will play two or three boards with many different partners. It's akin to a bridge version of a speed-dating event, and we hope that some may find new partners by the end of the night. These games are a lot more relaxed and social than most, but it's still a chance to win Masterpoints.

To make an individual game work, we need some ground rules. Here's how it goes. You will have one minute to determine what your new partner knows, but assume the yellow card.

To prepare, assume that the Yellow Card will be used. **Beginners**, this is what you have been taught. We suggest bringing a printed-out list of conventions you know printed out. Your partner will play whatever you are comfortable with.

**Advanced players:** You WILL play whatever YOUR beginner wants to play in the Individual. If two advanced players are paired, you can use a "CDB Good Player Individual" card, which we have available.

**Intermediate players:** We suggest downloading the Good Player advanced card and crossing out what you don't know and use that when you play with a more experienced player.

# **Chicago Players Win at District and National Levels**

On Monday, March 11, CDB held the ACBL-Wide Seniors Silver Point game. Club members Marjorie Zolla and John Miller not only won locally with a 64.77% game, but that score enabled them to win over all of District 13 and earn 10 Silver Masterpoints. To realize what an accomplishment this is, you need to know that District 13 comprises Chicago, Wisconsin, Upper Michigan, and Greater Milwaukee. Not only that, but all of the District 13 winners of Silver points were familiar faces and played in the CDB game. Francie Margolin and Sue Gauen came in 2<sup>nd</sup>, followed by Dave Schroeder and Rosede Olson at 3<sup>rd</sup>, Paul Prez and Carole Green at 4<sup>th</sup>, and Carolyn Naselli and Les White at 5<sup>th</sup>.

And this year we had very good representation in the Flight C North American Pairs. District 13 was represented by 4 pairs:

Come join us at Supervised Play on Fridays at CDB. We often have new players who come with little to literally no bridge experience. If you are looking for more chances to play in a limited-MP game, consider joining our Friday afternoon 299er game.

CDB offers Supervised Play at 10:30 for \$5, followed by a short break for lunch and a shortened (usually 18- or 21-board) 299er game at 12:15. This game now regularly has at least 4 full tables, so there's a nice spirit of friendly competition. But you do NOT have to attend the Supervised Play to join the game. If you come to both, there is no charge for the Supervised Play. This is a great way to practice and see the rules you have learned in actual use. The atmosphere is relaxed and supportive. It's also a great way to meet potential partners, so don't be afraid to come without a partner arranged in advance. #### Interested in Becoming a Life Master? Here's a Primer on Tournaments

Below you will see a list of upcoming tournaments. ACBL offers three levels of tournament play. If you are interested in moving up the ACBL levels and becoming a Life Master, you need to earn what they call "pigmented" Masterpoints—not only the Black points that you can earn at the usual Club games or on VACB BBO games, but also Silver, Red, and Gold points. Life Master rank requires 500 points, of which at least 75 are Black, 75 Silver, 50 Red, and 50 Gold. You can earn MPs at any tournament across the US and in many other countries, or even on some cruises. And you can attend for part of a day, an entire day, or basically as much as you want. Here are the levels, in increasing order of size, and what you can earn.

- Sectionals: Local tournaments that offer Silver MPs. Two to three days.
  - STaC weeks: Like the one the first week of April, win Silver points at the Club (hence the name, Sectional Tournament at the Clubs).
- Regionals: Designed for larger areas. Offer Gold MP for top winners and Red for others who place. Two to four days.
- ❖ Nationals (NABC): Offer Red and Gold MPs. Offered 3x a year, alternating among east, middle, and west regions of the US. Ten days or more. They're great fun—lots of energy, lots of events geared toward players at every level from under 5 MPs to international champions.
