## **Good CDB News from Memphis NABC**

"Our" Gino Ginossar was part of the second-place team in the Vanderbilt event at the Memphis NABC. For those who don't know him, let us explain. Gino is an Israeli bridge professional who moved to Chicago about 10 years ago with his wife, who was doing graduate studies at the University of Chicago. Gino adopted Chicago Duplicate Bridge as his homeaway-from-home club, offering lessons which benefited the club financially and helped to develop many of our beginning and intermediate players. His lessons continue as online Lessons with Gino. He remains a very good friend of the club, visiting us frequently when passing through the US to tournaments.

To place his achievement in context: There are three North American Bridge Championships per year. These 10-day tournaments have become de facto world championships because the

major events are contested by most of the top players from Europe and beyond. The major event at each tournament awards 250 Platinum points, the most of any event in the ACBL. The Vanderbilt is the major event for the spring NABC. It is a knockout event over 7 days and is a fully fledged International Championship.

Second place in this event is a BFD. Congrats to Gino and his team. Please send him your congratulations.

Gino was not our only high achiever in Memphis. Flight C in the North American Pairs (NAP) event was well represented by CDB players. All three C-flight pairs have strong ties to our club and are frequent attendees at our evening games and at our collaboration with Northwestern. Zinnia (a high school freshman) and Graham Meyer are the father-daughter pair who play when it is not a school night, and Rahul Garga (a recent University of Chicago graduate) and Charley Holmes (a current UC law student) often play in our evening games. All three pairs ended the first day of the event in the top 10; Rahul and Charley were in 2nd place.

The third pair, Ranmit and Manmit Pantle, missed first place in Flight C NAPs by less than half a Matchpoint after two days of play, which has to have been very painful. Ranmit is a Northwestern PhD student and Manmit is an options trader. The twins frequently demonstrate why married couples should not play with each other—a personal favorite being "when we get home I will explain to you why you are completely wrong."

We will have a reappearance of our quality stable in July when Ranmit, Manmit, and Rahul will be joined by Ben Fisk to represent the district in Philadelphia in the Flight C Grand National Teams. Our stable is strong, and our younger players are a delight to play against, unlike many

of the younger players around the country. You can meet them at our night games and the Northwestern weekend games, and we hope you will toughen them up for the summer.

Come join us at Teach and Learn on Fridays at CDB. We often have new players who come with little to literally no bridge experience. Don't be afraid that you are "too experienced" or "too new" to benefit from joining the group. If you are looking for more chances to play in a limited-MP game, consider joining our Friday afternoon 750/NLM ((non-Life Master) game.

CDB offers Supervised Play at 10:30 for \$5, followed by a short break for lunch and a shortened (usually 18- or 21-board) 750/NLM game at 12:15. This game now regularly has 4-6 full tables, so there's a nice spirit of friendly competition. But you do NOT have to attend the Supervised Play to join the game. If you come to both, there is no charge for the Supervised Play. This is a great way to practice and see the rules you have learned in actual use. The atmosphere is relaxed and supportive.
