Game Reservations

We strongly encourage you to use BridgeWebs to make reservations for ALL games. This will help the Directors plan their game for the potential number of tables, how many people need partners, etc.

Making reservations on BridgeWebs is easy! **Especially if you use the link below, which allows you to go straight to the calendar where you can make a reservation and/or request a partner.** You may need to enter your email address or ACBL number to log in:

If you can't get the link to work, send an email to chicagoduplicatebridge@gmail.com and we'll get you set up.

If you'd rather start from the BridgeWebs home page, you can use the following procedure:

- 1) Select "Results" under "Upcoming Games" from the main menu on the left.
- 2) Select the game you want to attend. You may need to move the calendar to the following month.
- 3) If you need a partner, select "Partner Required."
- 4) Enter your name. When you leave the site, your request will be registered.
- 5) If you have a partner, select "Reservation Requested."
- 6) If you're asked for your name or ACBL number, enter it.
- 7) Insert your partner's name in the box that comes up.
- 8) Select the direction you prefer: N/S, E/W, or Any.
- 9) Select "Add reservation."

Solo Players

We guarantee partners for all one-section games, so if you feel like showing up for a game at the last minute, feel free to do so. On the rare occasion that we have a two-section game, please contact the director in advance and we'll do what we can to find you a partner.

But the **best way to find a partner**, or help us find one for you, is to use the BridgeWebs online reservation system described above to sign up ahead of time (the earlier, the better!). The sooner you let the director know you're coming, the more likely you are to end up with a compatible partner.

Bridge Lessons

Following up on Les White's very successful first series of beginner bridge lessons, CDB is offering even more opportunities for beginner, intermediate and advanced players to improve their game! Each lesson takes place at 10:00 a.m. at the club on a Saturday morning and lasts 90 minutes. After a short lunch break, students are encouraged to join the 0-99 game or the open game at noon or stay for supervised play when it's offered. The separate fees for the lessons and the games are \$15. **But - if you attend both**, the total fee is only \$20.

February and early March will feature a repeat of the well-received beginner course taught by Les White:

- ❖ Saturday, February 7 – Lesson 1: Introduction to bridge
- ❖ Saturday, February 14 – Lesson 2: Basic bidding and responding
- ❖ Saturday, February 21 – Lesson 3: More bidding and responding (overcalls, simple doubles)
- ❖ Saturday, March 7 – Lesson 4: Even more bidding and responding (responses to no trump, Stayman and Jacoby transfers)
- ❖ Saturday, March 8 – Lesson 5: Review and supervised play

The beginner course also will cover topics like bridge etiquette, leads and discards, scoring and 2-over-1 bidding.

Then a new series of **intermediate/advanced lessons** will begin on March 14.

New Opportunities to Play Bridge at CDB

Beginning in January, the club increased your opportunities to play bridge with us. We're now offering a **0-99 game** on Saturdays at the same time as the open game at 12:00 noon. Also, on alternating Tuesday and Thursday evenings, we'll offer **social bridge** for any member who wants to bring a group of 4 (or 8 or 12) players to take advantage of the club's facilities, including duplicate boards and hand records, for only \$5/person.

Day Game Starting Time

To help people beat rush-hour traffic going home, **all afternoon games now begin at 12:00.** Please be on time! If you're stuck in traffic or otherwise running late, let your partner know and/or alert the director. We'll do our best to accommodate you.

February 3rd Mentor/Mentee Game

This month's Mentor/Mentee game is scheduled for **Tuesday, February 3 at 6:30 pm** at the club. Please use the online sign-up process to RSVP but **also email Dave Schroeder** at dave8459@yahoo.com to let him know you're planning to be there. It's important that both mentees and mentors **let Dave know as early as possible** so he can ensure that we have enough mentors for all the mentees.

The Mentor/Mentee game is intended to be nurturing and instructive, and it's a great way to get to know and learn from some of the most experienced players at the club. Another reason to attend the Mentor/Mentee game is that Dave bakes treats like cookies or brownies - whatever strikes his fancy - for everyone to share, and they're always delicious!

Special Games

February is Education Fund month, which mostly promotes junior bridge teaching but also supports some initiatives for seniors.

The other special games in February are:

- ❖ Saturday, February 7: ACBL-wide International Fund, which is a competition across North America that provides extra points, including gold for the winners in each District. If you do well, you might even see your name in the Bridge Bulletin!
- ❖ Saturday, February 28: GO LOCAL March Madness, which offers 33% red points.

All these games, including the Education Fund, award double black points, so February is a great time to play if you're looking to boost your masterpoints.

New/Intermediate Players: Improve Your Game!

In addition to the lessons, CDB offers these opportunities for newer players to improve their bridge skills:


- ❖ Supervised Play
 - Friday at 10:00 a.m., followed by a game at 12:00 p.m.
- ❖ 0-99er game
 - Saturday at 12:00 p.m.
- ❖ Mentor/Mentee game
 - 6:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday evening of the month, although occasionally that date changes – check the calendar in the newsletter or the CDB website to confirm.
- ❖ Brief lesson
 - Thursday prior to 12:00 p.m. game.

Supervised Play and Games. Join us for Friday morning Supervised Play, a coaching session where you can ask experts and more experienced players for advice. Don't worry that you are "too new" or even "too experienced" to join the group – it's a great opportunity to learn more about bridge for players at all levels!

Friday supervised play at 10:00 is followed by a brief break for lunch at 11:30 and a 750/NLM (Non-Life Master) game at 12:00 noon. This game now regularly has 4-6 full tables, and there's a nice spirit of friendly competition among a fun and welcoming group. **You do NOT have to attend supervised play to join the game or vice versa.**

The fees are \$5 for supervised play and the usual \$15 for the game. If you come to both, there is no charge for supervised play. The Friday sessions are a great way to practice what you've learned by playing bridge in a friendly environment and to meet potential partners. Social Bridge. The best way to get better at bridge is to play, play, and play some more. If you want noncompetitive practice with real duplicate boards and hand records to check yourself against, get a group together and come play in the back room where we hold lessons. Beginning in January, we're offering social bridge on alternating Tuesday and Thursday evenings as follows:

- ❖ Thursday, February 5 and 19
- ❖ Tuesday, February 10 and 27

Kibitzing. "Kibitzing" always has been part of bridge. You get to peek over the shoulder of an experienced player, and - at the appropriate time - ask them brief and polite questions about their bidding or play of the hand.

The etiquette is to approach a table and ask a player, "Would you mind a kibitzer?" Most players will not object, but not everyone is comfortable being watched. If the player declines, find someone else. Many players take it as a compliment if you choose to watch them, and you'll get to see different bidding methods, thought processes and playing techniques.

Kibitzers may watch one player for several hands but should plan on kibitzing with a few players over the course of a game to see a variety of bidding and playing styles. You'll soon figure out which players are most welcoming to kibitzers and eager to share their knowledge with them.

Important: Kibitzers are expected to sit where they can see only one hand and need to pretend to be invisible and maintain a poker face. Do not react to the bidding or play by making comments or facial expressions or you will be asked to leave.

Try kibitzing! - you'll learn a lot and meet some knowledgeable, interesting and nice people.

Restroom Keys

There are public restrooms a few steps away from our club, but they require a key for entry. You can find the keys on chains on a table near the club entrance. Please remember to bring the key with you when you leave the restroom and put it back on the table.

Don't Like Stairs?

If you park on Level 2 there are seven steps to negotiate to get to and from the club and that's an issue for some of our players. If you're driving, you can park in one of the handicapped spaces if you have a permit; they are on the right as you pull into the lot. Or you can park on Level 6 and take the elevator or ramps down to Level 2 in the building using NO stairs.

The Spring NABC in St. Louis a big deal (pun intended)!

We're lucky to have a 10-day NABC tournament coming up during February 25 – March 8 in St. Louis, which is just a 5-hour drive or short flight from Chicago. Bridge events will be held at the **Marriott St. Louis Grand**, including most NABC-rated and evening events. North American Pairs and daytime regional events will take place at the **America's Center**, which is right across the street from the hotel.

This NABC offers a great chance to dive into the world of bridge and explore St Louis. More advanced players can play in premier events that award platinum masterpoints, while those looking for gold points will have plenty of opportunities to earn those too. Newer players - even absolute beginners - can learn new skills in a space dedicated just for them.

In addition to a lot of bridge games, the St. Louis NABC will offer lessons for newer players plus opportunities to play other games and unusual versions of bridge:

- ❖ Catan, backgammon, cribbage and other games.
- ❖ Social bridge, Bridge Battle (a combination of bridge and war) and Crazy Bridge (a new rule for every hand).
- ❖ Bridge Mania – bridge-themed trivia games like “Jeopardy!” and “Family Feud.”

Sounds like fun!

Whether you attend the tournament for one or all 10 days, there will be plenty of opportunities to meet fellow bridge players from all over and play the world’s best card game.
