New Opportunities to Play Bridge at CDB

Beginning in January, the club is increasing your opportunities to play bridge with us. Beginning on Saturday, January 10, we're offering a **0-99er game** concurrent with the Open game at noon. The fee will be the usual \$15 for members. Also, on alternating Tuesday and Thursday evenings, we'll offer **Social Bridge** for any member who wants to bring a group of 4 players to take advantage of the club's facilities: the tables, bidding boxes, duplicate boards, hand records – and the free snacks, coffee and water available to all players. The cost is only \$5 per person.

Game Reservations

We strongly encourage you to make reservations for <u>ALL</u> bridge games. This will help the Directors plan their game for the potential number of tables, how many people need partners, etc. We welcome walk-ins and guarantee partnerships at all one-section games, but reservations are very helpful, especially if you'll need a partner, if you're running late or if there's a possibility that the game may not take place due to insufficient expected attendance.

Making reservations on BridgeWebs is very easy once you've done it once or twice! **Especially if you use the link below, which allows you to go straight to the calendar where you can make a reservation and/or request a partner.** You may need to enter your email address or ACBL number to log in:

If you'd rather start from the BridgeWebs home page, you can use the following procedure:

- 1) Select "Results" under "Upcoming Games" from the main menu on the left.
- 2) Select the game you want to attend. You may need to move the calendar to the following month.
- 3) If you need a partner, select "Partner Required."
- 4) Enter your name. When you leave the site, your request will be registered.
- 5) If you have a partner, select "Reservation Requested."
- 6) If you're asked for your name or ACBL number, enter it.
- 7) Insert your partner's name in the box that comes up.
- 8) Select the direction you prefer: N/S, E/W, or Any.
- 9) Select "Add reservation."

Solo Players

We guarantee partners for all one-section games, so if you feel like showing up for a game at the last minute, feel free to do so. On the rare occasion that we have a two-section game, please contact the director in advance and we'll do what we can to find you a partner.

But the **best way to find a partner**, or help us find one for you, is to use the BridgeWebs online reservation system described above to sign up ahead of time (the earlier, the better!). The sooner you let the Director know you're coming, the more likely you are to end up with a compatible partner.

Day Game Starting Time

To help people beat rush-hour traffic on their way home, all afternoon games now begin at 12:00. Please be on time! If you're stuck in traffic or otherwise running late, let your partner know and/or alert the Director. We'll do our best to accommodate you.

January 6th Mentor/Mentee Game

The new year will kick off with our popular Mentor/Mentee game, which is scheduled for **Tuesday, January 6** at **6:30 pm** at the club. Please use the online sign-up process to RSVP but **also email Dave Schroeder** at <u>dave8459@yahoo.com</u> to let him know you're planning to be there. It's important to **let Dave know as soon as possible** so he can ensure that we have enough mentors for all the mentees.

The Mentor/Mentee game is intended to be nurturing and instructive, and it's a great way to get to know and learn from some of the most experienced players at the club. We always hope to see lots of new/intermediate players there! But it's **important** that both mentees and mentors register with Dave in advance, by email or through the online system, so he can arrange to have enough mentors available and match up suitable partnerships.

Another reason to attend the Mentor/Mentee game is that Dave bakes treats like cookies or brownies - whatever strikes his fancy - for everyone to share, and they are always delicious!

New/Intermediate Players: Improve Your Game!

CDB offers these opportunities for newer players to improve their bridge playing:

- Supervised Play
 - o Friday at 10:00 a.m., followed by a game at 12:00 p.m.
- 0-99er game NEW beginning January 10!
 - o Saturday at 12:00 p.m.
- Mentor/Mentee game
 - 6:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday evening of the month, although occasionally that date changes – check the calendar in the newsletter or the CDB website to confirm.
- Brief lesson
 - o Thursday prior to 12:00 p.m. game.

Supervised Play and Games. Join us at Supervised Play, which is a learning session on Friday mornings at CDB. You can ask experts and more experienced players for advice and, for example, occasionally we replay hands the way they should have been bid. We often have new players who come with little to no bridge experience. Don't be afraid that you are "too new" or even "too experienced" to benefit from joining the group. If you're looking for more chances to play in a limited-MP game, consider attending our Friday afternoon 750/NLM (Non-Life Master) game or, beginning January 10, the Saturday 0-99 game.

Supervised Play at 10:00 on Fridays is followed by a short break for lunch at 11:30 and a 750/NLM game at noon. This game now regularly has **4-6 full tables**, and there's a nice spirit of friendly competition among a fun and welcoming group. **You do NOT have to attend the Supervised Play to join the game or vice versa.**

The fees are \$5 for Supervised Play and the usual \$15 for the game. If you come to both, there is no charge for Supervised Play. The Friday sessions are a great way to practice and use what you've learned by playing bridge in a friendly environment. It's also a great way to meet potential partners, so don't be afraid to come without a partner arranged in advance. Social Bridge. The best way to get better at bridge is to play, play, and play some more. If you want noncompetitive practice with real duplicate boards and hand records to check yourself against, get a group together and come play in the back room where we hold lessons. Beginning in January, we'll offer Social Bridge on alternating Tuesday and Thursday evenings as follows:

- Thursday, January 9
- Tuesday, January 13
- Thursday, January 22
- Tuesday, January 27

Kibitzing. "Kibitzing" always has been part of bridge. You get to peek over the shoulder of an experienced player, and - at the appropriate time - ask them brief and polite questions about their bidding or play of the hand. The etiquette is to approach a table and ask a player, "Would you mind a kibitzer?" Most players will not object, but not everyone is comfortable being watched. If the player declines, find someone else.

Most of the better players take it as a compliment if you choose to watch them. You'll get to see different bidding methods, thought processes and playing techniques. Many of them love being asked why they bid, played or defended a hand a certain way. Plus, you'll see that even experienced players sometimes make stupid mistakes.

Kibitzers may watch one player for several hands but should plan on kibitzing with a few players over the course of a game to see a variety of bidding and playing styles. You'll soon figure out which players are most welcoming to kibitzers and eager to share their knowledge with them.

<u>Important:</u> Kibitzers are expected to sit where they can see <u>only one hand</u> and need to pretend to be invisible and maintain a poker face. <u>Do not react to the bidding or play</u> by making comments or facial expressions or you will be asked to leave.

Try kibitzing! - you'll learn a lot and meet some smart, interesting and nice people.

Restroom Keys

There are public restrooms a few steps away from our club. A key is required to enter. You can find the keys on chains on a table near the club entrance. Walk out of the club, turn right, and walk to the end of the hall (girls on the left, boys straight ahead). Please remember to bring the key with you when you leave the restroom and replace it on the table when you return.

Please note that the stall in the Men's restroom is currently out of commission. The closest alternative stall is one level up on the 3rd floor and it's always unlocked. You can take the elevator or the (somewhat tortuous) stairs) to get there.

Don't Want to Do Stairs?

As we're getting used to our new space, we're figuring out the details that help make it better fit our players' needs. Some players have commented that if you park on Level 2 there are 7 steps to negotiate to get to and from the club. Here are three ways you can avoid stairs if they are a problem for you: (1) Have someone drop you off and pick you up out front. (2) Park in one of the handicapped spaces if you have a permit. They are on the right when you pull into the garage. (3) Park on Level 6 and take the elevator or ramps down to Level 2. There are NO stairs needed to get from Level 6 in the garage to Level 2 in the building.

This Chicago Sectional tournament, which takes place during January 30 – February 1, is reachable by public transportation and features an Irish pub! Please join us for a weekend of great bridge at all levels and/or for the annual dinner to celebrate service by leaders in the local bridge community (our own Barry Little was recognized last year). The new (to us) location for the tournament is the Irish American Heritage Center at 4628 N. Knox Ave.

Sectionals provide a wider range of competition than you can get at our local club and are a great way to improve your bridge skills and meet new people.

This three-day Sectional offers an opportunity to take home silver points and participate in a range of exciting events, with stratified pairs/teams, Swiss teams and 750 games.

Immediately after the Saturday game, the Chicago Contract Bridge Association (CCBA) will host its annual dinner meeting. Join the CCBA Board for pizza and salad, a review of 2025, the election of new Board members and awards presentations. Current CCBA President Loring Knoblauch, who is stepping down from that post in 2026, will be saluted for his tireless service to Chicago and Midwest bridge. The Irish American Heritage Center is located just east of the junction of the Kennedy and Edens expressways near the Wilson Ave. exit, making it convenient for most players. The IAHC is home to the popular Fifth Province Pub which serves Irish food and drink. The Pub usually opens at 6 p.m. but may be open that Saturday afternoon, which would provide a convenient spot for lunch during the Swiss teams game.
