Barry Says...

As all of you know, the last few years have been very difficult ones, not only for Chicago Duplicate Bridge, but for hundreds of clubs across the country that have had to either merge with other clubs or shut down completely, leaving a void for face-to-face bridge games.

At this time, I would like to personally thank our board members and directors for their creative efforts to keep our club open. I would also like to thank those members who have made monetary contributions far beyond the scope of their membership dues. If you want to continue playing face-to-face bridge, the fate of our club is in your hands.

Note that your membership entitles you to elect the 9 Board directors on a rotational basis. Our mission is to encourage and facilitate the growth of bridge in the City of Chicago. Our annual election will be held in early December.

CDB's Board has discussed ways to build attendance. We are open to fresh ideas. Please let us know what we can do to encourage more people to turn out for CDB's games. Given the rental market, changing locations is not an option, at least in the near term. In 2021, before we reopened post-pandemic, we investigated over 50 possible locations, including CDB's old space on Orleans, and were unable to find a space on the near north side that was affordable and had accessible parking. Those conditions have not changed.

We know other local games compete with CDB's games. If you regularly choose to play in those games, in lieu of coming to CDB, it's possible that CDB will close. If you do not want to see that happen, we suggest that, at a minimum, you consider splitting your play between those clubs and CDB. Some of you may prefer playing online. But there's nothing to substitute for the feeling of community and fun that comes from seeing your bridge friends!

Big Congratulations to Carl!

Carl Nelson achieved Diamond Master level this past month—5000 Masterpoints. We asked him to tell us a bit about his bridge history.

I'm glad that I hit the Diamond target -- Monday, September 24, 2023 -- at Chicago Duplicate Club, which so warmly welcomed Abigail and me when we moved to Chicago in 2019.

I first played duplicate in 1959, sat out most of the 1970s, played with Eric Branfman in DC for 40 years, won several regionals in mid-Atlantic region, won a few sectionals with Abigail in various parts of the US from LA to Vermont, played (not ACBL) in several countries from New Zealand to Sweden. Most fun club: Singapore, where young players and kibitzers were simultaneously playing on-line. Favorite tournament event, only outside US, is Swiss pairs. Watched tournaments grow every year in the 1960s to the declines we see now in the 2020s.

Upcoming Annual Meeting and Board Election




Mentor night is intended to be nurturing, and we hope to see many of you there. And there's a bonus: Director Dave Schroeder bakes a treat for each Tuesday night—cookies, brownies—whatever strikes his fancy. I/N players are welcome, regardless of whether you have a partner. But it is important to email Dave in advance and we will find you a partner. If you have a partner to play with, great; again, please let Dave know in advance. Mentors: If you are available, email us and we will match you up.

Take Your Tricks Before They Go Away!



Playing in a club game with a rising star, we both get pushy and end up in 6N from the East. S finds a heart lead – a dangerous lead against 6N. Usually you find a safe lead against 6N. Today it was right; they took the first 2 tricks and partner claims. Everyone playing this board took 11 tricks.

The lead of a spade, a club, or a diamond would make the hand far more interesting. But you still only have 11 top tricks: 5 clubs, 3 spades, and 3 diamonds, so you need one more. I've assumed a club lead here, but after a diamond or spade lead, simply win the DK or SA at trick 1 and then run the clubs.



This is the position as East leads the 5th and final club. What is North to discard now? A spade discard means that the spade suit runs for 4 tricks. A diamond discard creates a 4th diamond for trick 12. What if N discards the HA? E can now exit the HQ to the HK, and sets up the HJ for trick 12. North gets to pick her poison, but cannot escape.

Usually to set up a squeeze you must concede your loser early. If you try that here, they will cash 2 hearts – so you will find this in the strip-squeeze chapter.

Whenever you are one trick short of your contract, good advice is to "Run your long suit and hope that good things happen." This frequently creates an extra trick. Caution: You still need to watch the discards carefully to know which suit is cashing.

It is important to identify the threat cards in your hand, that is, those which could generate the additional trick. Here they are the HJ, S3, and the D3. This means you must keep all 4 spades and diamonds in the West hand, so you need to part with your two small hearts.

Advance to the Next Level with Pigmented MasterPoints!

Coming up this fall, there are lots of local or nearby opportunities coming up to earn more of those necessary pigmented points for your next ACBL level. See the list of upcoming tournaments below.

All Regional tournaments offer two-session Gold Rush events, where I/N players can earn gold and/or red points, as well as Open events. The Sectional tournaments offer silver points. If enough players express interest, we might be able to facilitate organizing car pools to the tournament in St. Louis. This is your chance to continue your successful climb up the ACBL ladder and see your name listed as one of our Rank Advancers. Once you become a Club Master, you will need some silver points for the next level; and once you are a Sectional Master, you'll need some red, gold, or platinum points. But more importantly, it's always a fun challenge to show off your club skills and compete on a bigger stage.

Parking

There are many parking options in the area in addition to the lot behind the club. Last month's newsletter had extensive information about Spothero and other parking options. Consider downloading the Spothero app; there are often cheaper parking alternatives in the afternoon, and free options for evenings (after 6pm) and weekends. Unlike at the Orleans location, the club doesn't care where you park, and we don't gain any money from using the building's lot. To encourage attendance at the club, we offer a discount for those who bring new or immobile players to the games or those for whom parking is a hardship. If you drive to the club, you may request \$5 off your entry fee. If you bring 3 others in your car, you may request a free entry.
