Back to Basics

Overcall 1-level opening suit bid, with a Double.

When opponents open the bidding, and your hand has reasonable 'merit', you are strongly encouraged to enter the auction with a *competitive-bid*. Why you should do this, with a Take-out Double, comes from the following reasons;

- ❖ You want to steal the contract from your opponents.
- ❖ You want partner to bid their best suit (i.e., *take-out* the opponent's bid).

What 'merit' does your hand require, to overcall with a take-out double?

- Shape; You should have a shortage in the opponent's suit (max. 2-cards). You should also have 3+card (potential) support in the other 3 suits.
- Hand Strength; You should have a hand with opening or near opening strength. Your hcp should be in the other 3 suits with 'redundant' points in the opponent's suit discounted.

Alternatively ...

You have a hand too strong to bid a suit (17+ hcp & quality 5+card suit) or too strong to bid 1NT (19+hcp & balanced with 2 stoppers). You plan to make a re-bid to clarify you have such a hand.

As this double could show un-limited strength, it is a *forcing-bid*, so you should have a prepared re-bid for all circumstances!



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Examples RHO has opened 1♥.

♠ A 9 7 6

♦ KJ93

♣ AJ84

13 hcp & a singleton ♥-suit. [Double for take-out]. You have support for any suit partner may bid.

♠ KQJ92

♠ A985

13 hcp & a singleton ♥-suit. Quality ♠-suit.

Here you **[Overcall 1♠]**. *Prefer* major (fit) over minor!

♠ K6

• 10 2

♦ AJ1093

♣ KQJ2

14 hcp, but no support for a ◆-suit take-out.

Here you [Overcall 2+].

♠ KQJ8

A Q 10 2

♦ AJ10

♠ KQ8

A 2NT opening hand!

[Double]. You will re-bid NT, and revise message; "19+ hcp and balanced".

♦ A 10

♠ KJ9

14 hcp & a 1NT opening hand! 3-card ▼-suit, no 5-card suit, too weak for 1NT overcall.

[Pass].

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• QJ

A Q 10 5

♠ QJ93

12 hcp and a 2-card ▼-suit.
But, reduce hcp by 3 points (discounted ♥QJ).

[Pass].

♠ QJ74

♥ Q

AQJ

♠ K9842

15-2 hcp & a singleton ♥-suit **[Double** for take-out]. *You have support for any suit partner may bid.*

♠ AKJ985

KQ93

♦ AJ10

void

18 hcp and a strong **♠**-suit.

[Double]. You will re-bid ♠-suit, & revise message: "strong suit & 17+ hcp".



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Message to Partner

Entering the auction with a take-out double, is generally stating;

"Partner, I have an opening hand, with a shortage in opponent's suit and an interest in competing in the auction. What is your best suit?

This is a forcing bid as, alternatively, I may have a very strong hand which I will disclose on my re-bid."

Partner, is obliged to respond, even with a hand that contains 0 hcp.

However, this obligation no longer applies if opponents make an interference bid ~ *over-caller can still make a rebid*. Nevertheless, partner should still endeavour to compete when holding 6+hcp. Partner's responses are covered elsewhere (<u>follow link</u>).

Note; In competitive bidding partner will prioritise responding with an unbid major. E.g., bidding their 4-card major rather than a 5-card minor.
