Griffins Trophy – More pairs urgently needed. Sessions start 1st June

The Griffins is a Summer Pairs competition that is fun and fair for all. It is a gentle introduction to teams scoring.

A handicap is applied to teams based on the players' ngs at the start of the competition, with the intention of levelling the field.

Although this is a Pairs competition, you must enter as a team of 4 as the movement does not allow for half tables. Pairs are drawn teammates at random at the start of each session, and you should not play with the same teammates twice.

The sessions start on Thursday $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ June at 7pm, and run on alternate Thursdays to $\mathbf{24}^{\text{th}}$ August. Normal table money applies.

You do not need to play in all the sessions, as the best 5 scores count towards the final result. There is an entry list on the noticeboard at the club, where you can register an interest in finding teammates. A minimum of 7 teams are required to ensure viability, so please sign up to ensure the competition goes ahead. The deadline for registering an interest is 19th May.
