### **How to Criticize your Bridge Partner, Part 2 by Fran Pilch**

A couple of Kibitzers ago, I presented "How to Criticize Your Partner, Part 1." I promised then to provide a follow-up article that included tips on how to mask your Surprise? Annoyance? Astonishment? when your partner passes your 2C opening bid, or when (as happened to my esteemed partner last week), you fail to recognize a 'new minor force' bid, leaving him in a 3/1 split.

But before I treat you to coping suggestions, let me begin with **A Cautionary Tale.** The game of Bridge tests not only our memories and resilience (for we all make SO many mistakes), it also tests our ability to cope with partner misbehavior. I'm not talking here about missing that 2C opener or a Texas Transfer – I'm talking about when a relationship becomes mightily strained by one partner loudly chastising another; and in extreme circumstances, calling the partner ugly, demeaning names. Yes, it happens. And it can result in .....**MURDER.**

No, you say. That could never happen in a bridge scenario. Think again!

Beautiful wife Myrtle and her husband John Bennett were playing bridge with their neighbors, the Holmans, in 1929. The Bennetts were losing, and John apparently made a poor bid. Myrtle called him "A bum bridge player!" John was having none of it, slapped her, and said he was leaving. Myrtle grabbed his gun and shot him dead! Shot him four times! At the trial, beautiful Myrtle cried copiously, and her attorney argued that it was accidental!

Believe it or not, the jury acquitted her.

So with that true bit of history in mind, let us return to "**Think Again**," situations. These are instances that cry out for you to criticize your partner! In **Think Again** cases, I urge you to curb your impulses, and exercise maximum self-control! Here are phrases about which you should **Think Again** before you utter them to your partner.

- 1) Those two cards in the dummy were good.
- 2) You just trumped my Ace.
- 3) You totally missed my signal.
- 4) What were you thinking when you.....(complete the sentence)
- 5) That was FORCING!
- 6) NO NO NO you can't pass my double!

I also urge you to reflect deeply when your partner says, "I welcome criticism." That statement is NEVER 100% true. A lot depends on how and when the advice is given! Also on the sheer quantity of criticism. And your tone of voice. Be cautious here!

Finally one of our resident therapists suggests the following exercise to develop your coping mechanisms. Stand in front of a mirror. Envision your partner passing your 2Club opening bid. Study the rolling of your eyes and the clenching of your teeth. Note your accelerated heartbeat and the rising flush in your cheeks! Now think of a beautiful meadow with lambs frolicking about. Briefly remember poor John Bennett's demise. Return to the happy meadow filled with flowers and a gurgling brook. Practice a compassionate smile! You have done it! You have mastered your emotions! You will not lash out at your beleaguered partner. Your partnership will survive, and you will live to see another bridge board!
