A letter from Unit 360's Treasurer:

Nov. 12, 2021

Dear Bridge Members,

It's been a tough two years for Unit 360. In 2020, we not only lost lives, but we were in the hole \$6,885. In 2021 to date, we have lost \$12,612. Fortunately, we had saved enough in our Building Fund to cushion these losses and also make much needed repairs to our parking lot as well as other small maintenance items due on our building. But our security funds are dwindling.

We are now facing tough economic times and lingering Covid issues. Our numbers are down at the clubs, and we are still losing money. The Board took a long hard look at the Budget proposals for 2022 and made some tough decisions.

With a goal of 3200 tables for 2022, the following is an example of what our Budget would look like:

Income \$24,142 Expenses 38,542 Net Loss -\$14,400

Therefore, we needed to add to our income to balance our budget. Beginning January 1, 2022, we are increasing playing fees to \$6. The Directors are also doing their part in taking a rent decrease of 50 cents per table. Please note that the Board is doing all we can to increase table count, and we are confident that these increases will be TEMPORARY.

You can do your part by playing at the club and encouraging your friends to play as well. Our focus is to bring new players into the club, and you will be hearing about our plans soon.
