Having grown up in a family that enjoyed cut-throat Hearts, at college I watched the nearly constant bridge game, eventually attempting to play. I still remember my first time. I think it was the third hand, I was dealt 28 HCP. I whimpered and said "Help". Told to just bid 3NT, it wasn't hard to make. I've never seen that good a hand since. I later worked in a group that always had lunchtime bridge, as many as four tables. One player and I

decided to try a local duplicate game, played once a week for most of 1979. Then I was transferred to Colorado and stopped playing but enjoyed reading Bridge columns. About nine years ago my wife suggested we visit the Bridge Center; we've been playing ever since.

In the early 70's I took three years off from school to work for what today would be called a start-up. Except that term hadn't been invented yet, nor had today's venture capital financing. 


