No Trump and Suit contracts are played AND Defended much differently!

In NT Contracts both the Declarer and the Defenders are racing to set up their winning tricks! **Why?**

Since there is no trump suit, or 'protection', once the high cards are played in a suit, then all of the little cards in that long suit become winners! STOPPERS are needed to prevent defenders from harvesting tricks in their long suits.

In NT contracts the Declarer Must frequently give up the lead early in order to set up his own winners!

- ** Do not plduring dummy until you have gone

 through steps 1-6. REALLY! Yes, this will take 30, 35 or even 60 seconds. As declarer you have the right to plan your play. AND Whatever time you take planning your play will more than be made up when you play out each trick. (You will get faster)
- 1. Where are the points? If the opponents bid, you should be able to estimate how many points are in every hand.
- 2. Opponents usually lead a suit for a good reason, try to figure why
- 3. Find which opponent holds the 'key' cards, & how many of them.
- 4. There are several different approaches to find extra tricks in No-Trump. Try to figure out which method(s) give you the best chance for success. Combining chances improves your odds.
- 5. The better the Plan that you make up front, the more likely that you will get all the tricks that your side deserves.
- Plans are important, but Plans often change during the play of the hand (suits rarely split as expected). Be flexible, don't panic, and adjust your plan as needed.
- * REMEMBER: Your real goal is to win every trick that is available, without risking your contract. This process will help you ID extra tricks that are available. In No-Trump you can set up extra tricks just as long as your contract is safe! Once stoppers are gone, it's over! Johnedietz@gmail.com 2.2.25
