East with 14 hcps, 6 spades and a singleton heart can now bid the game.</p> <p>When South leads ♥Q North must overtake with ♥A as he knows that East must hold ♥K. Despite seeing East's singleton ♥K appear, North should opt for a passive ♥2 return because opening a second side suit is more likely to benefit declarer than the defence.</p> <p>On this hand, declarer clears trumps and loses only two more tricks to North's ♠A and ♦A. Declarer can take the trick with ♥A and then try a club finesse. When this succeeds, he can return via ♠A to repeat the finesse.</p> <p>Ten tricks can be made, losing only ♣A and ♦AK. Perhaps un-bid major is the better idea.</p> <p>West takes trick with Q♠. Trying the K♠ confirms four-card suit at East, so Playing the A♠ establishes partner's last spade.</p> <p>When West gets the lead, a heart switch is avoided to "protect" Q♥ and to avoid promoting K♥. However, the heart holding may promote declarer's heart honour. Perhaps a spade lead is the better idea.</p> <p>The defence can find seven immediate tricks. On a heart lead declarer will be forced to play the Ace providing North as third hand plays high. Declarer can only take four diamond tricks before being forced to give the lead away. There are no entries outside the diamonds in dummy. West must not play the A♦ on the first round.
