

BBO Out of Time Adjusted Scores

When players run out of time to complete a hand during a session the computer will usually give an adjusted score straight away (which should be accepted), and the scores will be updated straight away.

On the occasions that the computer doesn't give an adjusted score the TD must do it manually. The TD can do it during the session, this necessitates the TD looking at the hand and working out an adjusted score, and then entering the score manually, all this whilst still playing themselves, the advantage of doing it during the session though is that the scores will be updated straight away, and there won't be a delay putting the scores on the website at the end of the session. The TD can however leave it until the end of the session if they wish, the disadvantage of this is that the TD will then have to wait up to 20 minutes for the scores to update before they can start downloading the results. This will also delay putting the scores on the website, for this reason the TD will always endeavour to update the scores during the session.

When players run out of time to complete a hand on the last round and the session ends, the computer will not give an adjusted score, the TD must do it manually. This means that after they have adjusted the score the TD will then have to wait up to 20 minutes for the scores to update before they can start downloading the results, and there will be a delay putting the scores on the website.

For this reason, on the last round the TD will often add time so that the hand can be completed and the TD doesn't have to give an adjusted score, they don't have to wait up to 20 minutes for the scores to update before they can start downloading the results, and there won't be a delay putting the scores on the website, it is not done to give anyone an advantage.
