West knows East has ♣K and because he has ♣Q he plays ♣8, the highest club he can afford, to encourage East to continue clubs. East continues with ♣KJ. Declarer wins ♣A and plays on diamonds but provided the defenders give nothing away declarer may find he cannot make more than seven tricks. North is not minimum so bids on to game. West leads ♣3, the fourth highest. He doesn't lead spades because South bid spades. East plays ♣Q and declarer takes ♣A. Because of the bad diamond break declarer will struggle to make nine tricks. Declarer wins ♣A and cashes ♥Q. Now he enters dummy with ♣K and cashes ♥A K J. North wins ♦A and tackles clubs. There is a twist here: he should play ♣Q, swallowing up South's ♣J. West has no more than the nine points he has shown by bidding 2♣ and has a difficult choice. The best he can do is to choose the known 5-2 spade fit.</p> <p>South leads ♦Q, top of a sequence. East wins ♦A. This is not a comfortable hand to play because declarer has only seven trumps. He must try to make some club tricks while ♠K is still an entry to dummy so declarer plays a club at trick 2. Perhaps North takes ♣A and returns a diamond.
